Around the State

YQCA Updates

YQCA is offering a 25% discount for the month of April for the online training. All in-person trainings are cancelled due to our restriction on in-person meetings through May 31.

As of now, it is still required that youth exhibiting in beef, dairy, goats, sheep and/or swine complete YQCA. If you still need to fulfill the requirement, you will have to take the training online at yqca.org. Here are a few instructions:

- Use the 4-H Online option to log-in.
- If you want to pay online using a credit card, you have to pay the full \$12. The 25% discount cannot be applied through the online payment method.
- If you want the discount, follow the instructions sent in an email from Jennifer. Those instructions include a coupon form that you must mail in along with a check for \$9.
- You can still test out of age ranges, but that also requires paying the full \$12/year fee.
- At this time, we don't anticipate rescheduling any inperson trainings for this 4-H year.
- The deadline to complete this training is still June 1.If that changes, we will let you know.
