- 1. Your enrollment packet should be obtained from your 4-H leader.
- Pick out your new project(s) for the year and re-enroll in 4-H Online at https://il.4honline.com. Do NOT pay online program fee—this is covered by working in the 4-H Concession Stand at the Fair. *New members after 2017 that live outside of the county are subject to an additional \$10 fee—paid to the Extension office.
- 3. Sign your Agreement to Assume Risk and Release from Liability form and return to your leader.

Enrollment is not finalized until everything is complete.

Additional projects may NOT be added after Feb. 1.

YOUTH MOUALITY CARE ANIMALS ATTENTION LIVESTOCK MEMBERS!

IF YOU ARE ENROLLED IN DAIRY CATTLE, BEEF CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, AND/OR GOATS:

All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be <u>required</u> to certify in the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animals** (**YQCA**) program, by attending class taught by a local veterinarian.

March 31, 7p.m., Monroe County Annex, 901 Illinois Ave., Waterloo

There is a **\$3 fee** to YQCA to certify *each year* if you exhibit one of the above livestock species.

TO REGISTER: Go to https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login

Log into your 4-H Online account.

Select member that is enrolled in one of the above listed livestock projects.

Choose their appropriate age and choose "Instructor-Led Training." \$3.00.

Choose Illinois and then the training you wish to attend, then click on the red "Purchase Course" button.

Training must be paid for via credit card. If this option is not available for your family, please contact your local Extension office.

Repeat registration process with each family member required to take the training.

IF YOU ARE ENROLLED HORSES, RABBITS, POULTRY, DOGS, AND/OR CATS:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs. 43 Years of Dedication to Monroe County...

On February 9, 1977, Pamela (Auld) Jacobs was interviewed for the **4-H Youth Adviser** position in Monroe County. She had been an active 4-H member in Washington County and learned of Extension positions from current staff. At that time, the Monroe County Joint Extension Councils members included: Willard Kleyer, Richard Woodcock, Virginia Mueller, Pat Rehmer, Norene Reeves, Laverne Whelan, Don Schrader, Lyle Hoffmann, Stephen Hoefft, Mrs. Theodore Ruff, Mrs. Steingruby and Rosemary Yaekel. The Extension Advisers were: Arlin

Obst and Martha Malmberg and the Regional Director was Glen Sons. According to the minutes, Pam received the most votes and it was approved for her to be hired into the 4-H Youth Adviser position. She began in the position on **February 21, 1977.**

Pam provided leadership to the Monroe County 4-H program until **1992**, during an Extension reorganization, when she applied and was offered the **Unit Leader** position after the Monroe County Extension referendum was successfully passed.

During another Extension reorganization, Pam was offered the **County Extension Director** for the new Unit 22 which was formed of Monroe, Madison and St. Clair counties. She will complete her Extension career, December 31, 2019.

During her Extension career, Pam has experienced great joys, sadness, achievements, vast opportunities and the very best support and friendship from colleagues and volunteers! It has been a wonderful career and she offers *thanks* to everyone! (Continued...)

Some great memories that Pam holds...

- In the summer of **1977**, she assisted at the **Illinois State Fair in** 4-H Department for a week. Lodging was in Jr. Home Economics building in a large room with many bunk beds, no air conditioning, showers with wooden slats and foggy mirrors. Even after that experience she still returned to the State Fair *many times*, helping with a variety of 4-H responsibilities. It was heart-warming for her to watch county 4-H members proudly exhibit award winning projects.
- Thousands of people have seen Pam's face in the **4-H Concession Stand at the Monroe County Fair** over the years, making fun memories working with 4-H members dip and sell ice cream and make sno-cones. Early in her career, she and the Home Economics Adviser **made gallons and gallons of the sno-cone syrup**! It was only available as flavoring so they stirred bags and bags of sugar in boiling water to turn it into the syrup!
- In **1984**, she worked with an Extension Agriculture Adviser to establish the county **4-H Beef Premiere program**...the same program that exists in Monroe County today.
- During the early days, Extension Office was on the second floor of the Farm Bureau building located on West Mill Street. Staff and volunteers carried tables, program supplies and more up and down the **19 steps!** They even held 4-H Halloween events in the scary basement of the building.
- She drove a van full of 4-H members to Lawrence, Kansas for 4-H Exchange trip.
- She spent time working with great volunteers on the Extension tax referendum which was passed in March 1992.
- During the **Great Flood of 1993**, the County, State and Federal Emergency Management Service was located in the meeting room on the second floor of the Mill Street Extension office. Many local people stood in line on the steps to receive flood recovery assistance. Monroe County Extension was an active partner with local agencies to offer activities and events to flood affected youth and we established the first after school youth program at Valmeyer School.
- In September of 1996, Pam and staff moved the Extension Office into the new County Annex, 901 IL. Ave., Waterloo
- When the county had a **4-H Swine Premiere Program**, Pam weighed pigs on farm sites. She made sure to schedule these visits at the end of the day so she did not return to the office to share the odor from her clothing.
- She has enjoyed with the dedicated Monroe County Extension & 4-H Education Foundation board members and Friends of Extension on 12 years of **Harvest Night** fundraising to support 4-H programs, scholarships, Baebler Educational Farm development, Master Gardener and Master Naturalist programs and more. She gives a special thanks to Monroe Co. families and businesses for great support!
- For many years, she served as a chaperone to **4-H Camp** held at West Frankfort, IL. She even attended this 4-H Camp as a Washington County 4-H member!
- She also served as a chaperone to **National 4-H** in Chicago. It was a great honor for her to be with national 4-H awardees.
- Pam has served University of Illinois Extension in many leadership capacities, lending to many trips to and from the U of I Campus in Champaign.

Throughout her **nearly 43 years of service** to Monroe County, Pam has enjoyed watching 4-H members grow into successful careers and become active community members, with many becoming volunteers to 4-H programs. She has had the pleasure of hiring great 4-H alumni college students to assist with summer programming and working with great staff and volunteers through the years!

Pam is very proud of Monroe Co. 4-H and we are <u>thankful</u> to all of her dedication in building up the 4-H program and other Extension programs throughout her years of service.

7th Grade Agriscience Roadshow

MONROE COUNTY EXTENSION & 4-H EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Applicants must be seniors in high school and/or have not reached their nineteenth birthday on or before September 1, 2019 and must have been enrolled and active in a 4-H club program for at least <u>four</u> consecutive years. The applicant must be a resident of Monroe County and/or attend the Waterloo, Columbia, Valmeyer or Red Bud School districts. 4-H members can only receive the Scholarship once. IAA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

Application link and all supporting materials including eligibility can be found at <u>www.iaafoundation.org.</u> Please read all instructions carefully and refer to the FAQ document on the website to help answer any questions. Students can apply between now and February 1, 2020. All required information must be submitted by that date, no exceptions. As the charitable arm of the Illinois Farm Bureau, our Mission is to fund education, research, and charitable activities that benefit Illinois farm families and agriculture. We proudly offer scholarship opportunities for students pursuing degrees related to agriculture, and those with family farming backgrounds.

FARM CREDIT ILLINOIS SCHOLARSHIPS

High school seniors planning careers in agriculture may apply for a \$2,000 scholarship. Farm Credit Illinois will provide 30 scholarships to youth who live or farm in one of the 60 counties in their service area. Nominations open for 2020 Salute to Excellence Volunteer awards

- Volunteer of the Year recognizing individuals who have served as 4-H volunteers for less than 10 years at the local, county, region and state level
- **Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer** recognizing individuals who have served 10 or more years at the local, county, region or state level.

Nominations are due to the County Office by December 20, 2019 which will allow us to meet the *Thursday, January 9, 2020* submission deadline set by the State 4-H Office. Submission criteria is available at the Extension Office.
