4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION GUIDELINES

UPDATED guidelines for the 2022 4-H/FFA Livestock Auction as determined by the Monroe County 4-H/FFA Livestock Auction Committee are:

- Exhibitors may sell: one large specie: Beef, Sheep or Swine (sold by lb.)
- one large specie: beet, Sneep or Swine (sold by 10.) and
- one small specie: Goat, Rabbit or Poultry (sold by head/pen)



4-H SHOW REQUIREMENTS

As we begin the new 4-H year, please remember that in order to show projects at the County and State levels at the end of the year, you must meet the following requirements:

- \rightarrow Attend at least 4 meetings during the year
- \rightarrow Give a talk or demonstration
- \rightarrow Enroll in 4-H online by January 1, 2022.
- → All livestock project members must show an *in-progress* Livestock Record Book to their Leader at their May, June or July club meeting prior to the county fair.
