

4-H SHOW REQUIREMENTS

As we enter into 4-H Show season, please remember that in order to show projects at the County and State levels at the end of the year, you must meet the following requirements:

- → Attend at least 4 meetings during the 4-H year.
- → Give a talk or demonstration at a club meeting.
 - → Enroll in 4-H online by January 1, 2022.
- → All livestock project members must show an *in-progress* Livestock Record Book to their Leader at their May, June or July club meeting prior to the county fair.

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)

If you missed the in-person YQCA trainings, you can still take the training online for \$12.00.

YQCA training is required for any youth exhibiting

BEEF, DAIRY, GOAT, SHEEP and/or SWINE at the County Fair.

REGISTER:

Register for a NEW account under a PARENT name and fill out all required fields.

Confirm your account through a link sent to your email.

Click on the blue "Add Child" button on the YQCA website and enter required fields for each child participating in the YQCA training.

Next, click on your user name in the blue box in the upper right hand corner.

Choose "Enrolled ILT Trainings" from the dropdown list.

Click on the blue "Go to Courses" button.

Click on the blue button indicating child's age next to his/her name.

Choose appropriate age and "Web Based Training" for \$12.

Next, choose participants name, state and training date.

Training must be paid for via credit/debit card. If this option is not available for your family, please contact the Extension office asap.

Repeat registration process for each family member required to take the training.

QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS CERTIFICATION (QAEC)

Taking the QAEC training is mandatory for:

horse, rabbit, poultry, dog, cat & small pet projects shown live or via an Animal Science project.

All county and state horse and dog exhibitors must complete QA&E Certification via this site <u>one time</u> during their 4-H showing career. Those that have completed it in the past do not have to complete it again.

4-H Green communities Program

Baebler Educational Farm is now home to an oak tree savanna thanks to youth from the 4-H Cruisers and Golden Eagles 4-H Clubs through a partnership with the Monroe County Soil & Water Conservation District.

Illinois once held 14 million acres of trees, but that number has dropped to 5 million due to modern development practices. Illinois 4-H partnered with Illinois Soil and Water Conservation Districts to help turn the tide by planting 775 oak trees in 31 counties across Illinois this spring.

The Baebler Educational Farm location was chosen to honor the many volunteers who dedicate many hours of hard work and dedication to preserving the farm for enjoyment and learning by local youth.

Illinois State Fair Junior Horse Show: July 24-30, IL State Fairgrounds

Ownership and/or lease paperwork must be placed on file at the local University of Illinois Extension office by <u>May 15</u>. In addition to the ownership/lease papers, two photos, one of each side of the animals will be mandatory for all horse and ponies, grade and registered animals. We strongly encourage members, if they own or lease more than one horse, to file paperwork on ALL potential exhibit horses by the deadline. If a horse is injured or dies, it may be replaced ONLY by a horse whose paperwork is already on file by the deadline.
