Computer Lab

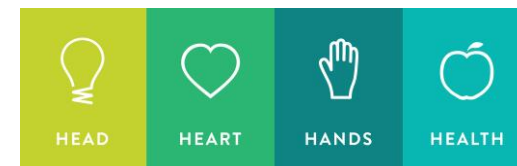

How do local 4-H clubs work?

Most local clubs meet once a month, conducting a business meeting, engaging in diverse learning activities, and building friendships among the members. Most clubs also participate in community service projects.

When you join a club, you pick project areas for the year. Project books are full of information and learning activities for the member. At the end of the 4-H year, you can create an exhibit in your project area for judging at the 4-H fair.

Who can join?

Any student age 8-18 (as of September 1) is eligible to join a 4-H club. Some clubs also have a Cloverbud program for 5-7 year olds.
