\*CHANGES\* Meeting Guidelines: Beginning September 1st, the following guidelines are in place: gathering size limited to the lesser of <u>25 people indoors and outdoors</u> or 25% of space capacity. For example, if your indoor space can hold <u>100</u> people you can have <u>25 people inside</u>.

Join Us for A Free Virtual Leaders Training! – Adult and youth 4-H volunteers from Carroll, Lee and Whiteside County are invited to participate in a free 4-H Virtual Leader Training on Saturday, October 17 from 9 am to noon. Participants will build their knowledge and skills with others from around Northern Illinois in this Zoom-based training. Attendees can select from a variety of breakout sessions to customize the experience to fit their needs and interests. Topics include youth engagement, inclusion, livestock, food access, alumni, mindfulness, awards, outdoor recreation, and more. Sessions will be taught by State 4-H Specialists and other Extension Professionals. Registration is required to participate, and attendees get a free 4-H shirt.
