

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

CLOVERBUD CO-LEADER

Role:

This volunteer will help provide leadership and education to approximately 20 4-H Cloverbuds, ages 5-7 with the Monroe County 4-H Program Coordinator.

Responsibilities:

Help plan the yearly program and activities for 5-7 year old members that are fun and integrate 4-H Positive Youth Development. (Resources available through the Extension office.)

Time Required:
