- You will not order project publications in 4-H Online. After enrolling, you will receive an email confirmation which will allow you to order on a separate site.














#### **4-H CLUB MEETING GUIDELINES**

As we begin our new 4-H year please keep these guidelines in mind when meeting in person:

- Remember to bring and wear your face mask to all meetings.
   You will not be allowed to stay at the meeting without a mask. If you do not have a mask, please reach out to your club leader prior to your meeting.
- Be sure to keep a safe distance from others. If you are sitting close to your family that is fine but you should have 6 feet between those outside of your household.
- Thoroughly wash hands and/or provided hand sanitizer prior to meeting.





## **4-H SHOW REQUIREMENTS**

As we begin the new 4-H year, please remember that in order to show projects at the County and State levels at the end of the year, you must meet the following requirements:

- ightarrow You must attend at least 4 meetings during the year, either in person or virtually.
- ightarrow You must give a talk or demonstration, either in person or virtually.
- → You must be enrolled in 4-H online by December 1st, 2020 (the system is currently being upgraded but as soon as it is ready for enrollment you will receive instructions).



## **4-H ACHIEVEMENT PROGRM UPDATE!**

A county-wide 4-H Achievement Program will not be held this year due to COVID-19 restrictions. Alternatively, your club leader will be provided with your awards as well as ribbons from the summer 4-H Shows to acknowledge you at your club meetings this fall.

# Illinois 4-H Experience Award Application

The Illinois 4-H Experience Award Application focuses on all of those events and activities that you have experienced during the 4-H year in four areas: Participation, Community Service, Leadership, and Project Learning. Depending upon the type and number of experiences you can report on, members can receive recognition on the Bronze, Silver, Gold, Diamond or Emerald Clover Award level. Your family calendar, 4-H notes or county summary, checkmarks, and a few written details are all that's needed for even the youngest members to submit this application. # Illinois 4-H Scholarship

The Illinois 4-H Scholarship is a merit-based scholarship to award outstanding work in project areas. Five \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded in each of the following categories: Animal Science, Civic Engagement/Global Living, Creative Performing Arts & Communication, Food Systems, Healthy Living/ Nutrition, Leadership, Natural Resources & Environmental Science, Personal Growth and STEM/Robotics. The deadline to apply is November 1. Apply online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hscholarships.
