County Participants must be enrolled in the Communications project area to be eligible for the state speaking contest.

The state Public Speaking contest will be held Saturday, June 5 at Richland Community College, Decatur, IL. Each youth may only compete in one individual division and one group division in the state contest.

All participants are to have prepared and be ready to turn in an "Introduction Sheet" when you arrive on the 20th. The Introduction should include name, topic, and a brief description of the presentation, it may be written on an index card.

Conference judging will occur after each presentation. No live animals are allowed in speeches.
