Fruit Tree Pruning: The "Older Neglected" and the "Just Planted"

This course will go over the basics of fruit tree pruning, steps to take to get started, and guidance on pruning trees that have never been pruned to those that have just been planted in 2019. This year's fruit tree pruning classes will be held virtual, using the zoom platform. "While you might think that you cannot learn to prune using a virtual format, Grant has developed a color-coded system for teaching people how to prune that works really well to help you understand what to prune and what to leave behind.

According to the Livestock Management Facilities Act (LMFA), livestock facilities in Illinois that house more than 300 animal units are required to have at least one certified livestock manager. Four webinars (virtual workshops) will be offered. You must attend the whole webinar (about 4 hours) to be eligible for your certificate. After the webinar, those with over 1,000 AU will be required to log in and take the 40-question online test in lieu of the IDoA's paper-based test.
