

Peoria County 4-H Virtual Fair News 2020



You have worked so hard on your 4-H projects and we are excited to see your work.

Even though we can't see you in person this year, online judging is a chance to share what you have learned, and to get feedback from a judge to help you think about your goals and plans for next year. Exhibits will be judged in the closed-access FairEntry System. (<http://peoria4-hfair.fairentry.com>) After judging is complete, we will look for different ways to share your exhibits for public viewing. Here are some tips to help you plan for your online judging experience:

1. Most exhibits will require a 4-H Project Report and three photos (a photo of the overall exhibit and 2 photos that provide a close up of a skill, technique or content area that you would like to report). In a small number of project areas, additional documentation is required. Examples include a video showing your exhibit in action (such as robotics, computer program and live animals) or additional word document/PDF (such as crop record or creative writing sample).
2. This year for online judging a Microsoft PowerPoint or Google Slides option is available as an alternative to creating a physical poster presentation. If you have already started your poster, you can upload photos of your poster as previously described. The slideshow option is also available as an alternate to uploading several individual photo images. Slideshows should be no more than 10 slides. Slideshows of a maximum 20 slides are allowed for multi-year project binder/portfolio exhibits or large collection displays, including: My Financial Future: Adv., Entomology 3, Rock Hounds 1-2, Communications, Journalism, and Leadership 2-3.
3. An important part of the 4-H judging experience is to provide you an opportunity to share what you have learned with the judge. Because you are not able to meet in person with the judge, the 4-H Project Report is a key part of sharing what you have learned. A project report template is available for you and should be saved and uploaded with your FairEntry registration. This is required for every 4-H exhibit and should be no more than 1 page.
4. Each exhibit has different instructions on what documentation to upload into FairEntry. You can find the instructions for your project area and class in the Peoria County 4-H Virtual Show Book or on the 4-H Online Judging Exhibit Requirement Spreadsheet. **The Peoria Virtual Show Book and spreadsheet can be found on our Unit website at: <https://go.illinois.edu/FMPTVirtual4-HShows> - Show Book requirements still apply.**
5. If you run into trouble with uploading your exhibit documentation, please contact the Extension office at 685-3140 or email: jschiere@illinois.edu or ludolph@illinois.edu. We are here to help you!
6. Tips on Taking Photos of Your Exhibit:
 - *Include a small card or piece of paper with your name and county in each photo
 - *Remove glass or plastic before taking photos to avoid glare
 - *Choose a location with good lighting to take photos of your exhibit – use natural lighting if possible.
7. Note: A few exhibit areas are difficult to share via photos. A video of no more than 3 minutes is required for robotics, computer science, video, and maker projects. Instructions on how to share your videos for these projects will be on our Unit website at: <https://go.illinois.edu/FMPTVirtual4-HShows>
8. More detailed instructions for livestock, horse, dog and public presentation contests will be located on our Unit website at: <https://go.illinois.edu/FMPTVirtual4-HShows>. Videos for these projects will be uploaded to a box file at: <https://uofi.app.box.com/f/3700d36ce9454ce1a79dc54e0e30141c>
9. Remember: judging comments can be helpful, but they are only one person's evaluation.
10. Once completed, exhibit photos/videos and awards will be posted for public viewing. This is a requirement for Ag Premium Eligibility. Remember that Ag Premium awards are subject to modification or cancellation in any year for which the General Assembly fails to make an appropriation to fund the premiums." (30 ILCS 120/14(d))

We look forward to seeing what you have learned this year and celebrating your accomplishments!!

IMPORTANT! READ THIS for Animal projects

For youth enrolled in Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat and Dairy Cattle (Showing live animals): **This is for virtual shows too.**

New statewide requirement is that members in these projects must complete YQCA – Youth for the Quality Care of Animals.

Must be done **EVERY YEAR** (starting in 2020) they are in the project.

- Youth may take training online individually at <http://yqca.org>. Cost for this is \$12 per youth. **We have a limited amount of coupons to cover the \$12 cost. To request a coupon send an e-mail to Julann at: jschiere@illinois.edu. First come, first serve.**

Why? This program is being adopted as it is the nationally recognized, sanctioned, and accepted certification program for all national shows, and is a great education piece that supports 4-H market animal projects. It is the only quality assurance program accepted by packers that can replace PQA and BQA. It is felt that this is an important educational component to the 4-H projects involved.

Important Note: Youth in multiple species will be required to take both trainings when appropriate.

Examples: Dairy Cattle and Poultry means you would take YQCA for Dairy and QAE (if you've never taken it) for Poultry. Horses and Poultry means you only take QAE for both species.

State Fair Premium Books

The 2020 Illinois State Fair Premium/Rule Book is now posted. It is posted as Draft and will stay that way as minor changes may be added by Dept. of AG. For youth enrolled in Horses, Rabbits, Poultry, Dogs and Cats (Showing live animals)

The Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAE) training is still required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. If you have already taken this for one of the above animals, then you are covered. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the project, and will not be eligible to exhibit at county shows. The website is open year round @ <http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/>. **For virtual shows too.**

NOTE: Youth must use a computer for this program; not a tablet or smartphone.

NOTE: For any animal science display or poster projects - If a 4-H member is showing a poster or other display (not a live animal) at the 4-H General Show, they now do NOT have to do any type of ethics training. They can do it if they want to but are not required to. It is still a good learning experience.

Copyright / Trademark Laws and Visual Arts Projects

Art using any form of protected graphics (including school logos and the 4-H emblem) cannot be used unless the 4-H member has accompanying documentation of permission to use the items. Visual Arts projects using items protected by copyright/trademark laws cannot be advanced to State Fair. If you have any questions about using an item please call the Extension office at 685-3140.

Trophy sponsorships are needed for the 2020 4-H show. Due to the unusual circumstances this year trophy plaques will be awarded to only a few classes in each livestock category and fancy rosette ribbons will be awarded for the other livestock classes and all non-livestock project areas. 4-H Spirit Display Contest

All Peoria County 4-H Clubs are invited to create a Virtual 4-H Spirit Display for our virtual 4-H Fair. The goals of the display are to:

- Promote 4-H
- Opportunity for club members to work together on a creative project.

- Promote your 4-H club

Display Guidelines:

- Include club name as part of display.
- Virtual display can be a flyer your club members create to show their 4-H Spirit, a video, a collection of photos of something your members did to showcase their 4-H Spirit (for example: if you paint a bunch of green 4-H flamingos and put them all over town - take pictures of it and upload the pictures) etc.. The possibilities are limitless.
- Upload your photos or videos, etc. to our Unit's google album at: <https://go.illinois.edu/Peoria4-HSpirit> by Friday, July 24. Please include a description or watermark to your photos, etc. when you upload or send to Cathy and she will add. Don't forget to include club name somewhere in your display.
- Make sure there is a photo/video release form on file at the Extension office for anyone included in a video or photo. Ask members prior to taking a photo, etc. if it is ok if they are included in the photo or video. The Spirit Displays will be featured on the Peoria 4-H Facebook Page for public viewing.
- Judging - will take place on Monday, July 29 and the winner will be announced shortly after.
- 2020 Theme - "In 4-H, you can....."
- Judges are looking for Creativity, Use of Theme and Club Name in display.
- Be creative and have fun with your display!
- **Award-** In addition to the "4-H Spirit" Award Stick Federation is giving a \$50 cash award to the 1st place club virtual display and a \$25 cash award to the 2nd place club virtual display.

Peoria County 4-H Leadership Scholarship Award (\$100 x 2)

The 4-H Leadership Scholarship Award is for older 4-H members and 4-H Alumni (ages 17 - 21). The purpose of the award is to recognize youth for exhibiting outstanding leadership during their 4-H involvement. Two winners will be chosen each year to each receive the \$100 4-H Leadership Scholarship Award. This award is sponsored by the Peoria County 4-H Federation youth through the Peoria County 4-H Auction Committee.

Applicants must be either current 4-H members who are High School Seniors or Peoria County 4-H Alumni that are currently enrolled in an approved post High School educational program (Junior College, 4-year University, trade School, etc.)

Applications are available on the Peoria County 4-H website. Applications must be submitted by June 30, 2020 for consideration. The award winner will be announced in July.

Doris Schoenbein Memorial Scholarship Award (\$500)

All high school seniors or 4-H alumni enrolled in a junior or four year college or a trade school are eligible to apply for the Doris Schoenbein Scholarship Award regardless of future career plans.

The purpose of the award is to recognize youth for exhibiting outstanding leadership, citizenship & community service participation during their 4-H involvement. One winner will be chosen each year to receive the \$500 Doris Schoenbein Scholarship Award. This award is sponsored by the Peoria County 4-H Auction Committee to honor Doris Schoenbein for her many years of dedication as a 4-H Volunteer Leader and support of the 4-H Program.

Applications are available on the Peoria County 4-H website. Applications must be submitted by June 30 2020 for consideration. The award winner will be announced in July.

Shooting Sports volunteers needed



Many young people don't have someone to show them how to safely handle a firearm or bow. Think back to the person who taught you to shoot. The Illinois 4-H program needs adults willing to serve as mentors and share their passion of shooting sports. You can choose your discipline of interest: Shotgun, Rifle, Archery, Pistol, and Hunting & Wildlife. To volunteer here's what you need to do:

1. Contact the Peoria Extension office at 685-3140 and complete the required forms and background checks. The Extension office will complete your registration.
2. Complete a 3-hour online training module at home.
3. Attend a 9-hour hands-on field day which runs from 9 AM to 7 PM. Check with the Extension office for assistance with the \$85 training fee.

Unfortunately the June 13, 2020 4-H Leader Certification Training in Pike Co. (western IL) had to be cancelled. It is necessary that shooting sports trainings are done face-to-face so it will be re-scheduled. If we're allowed to insert a summer training at 4-H Memorial Camp, we will make every effort to do so. Certainly, all fall shooting sports trainings and events are still being planned! The next training scheduled is for Sept. 12, 2020 at Torstenson Center, Winnebago Co. (northern IL). September and October State Shoots are also still being planned.


The 4-H Everyday Sportsman's Skills Challenge


