4-H Online Enrollment

If you haven't already now is a good time to enroll or re-enroll in 4-H! The enrollment process is to be completed through the new 4-H Online 2.0, <http://v2.4honline.com>. Here are some tips.

Re-enrollment: If you are re-enrolling, DO NOT create a new profile. You will need the email address and password you created last year. If you can't remember which email you used, please call the Extension office. If you forgot your password, just use the "Reset password?" option on the login screen. Once you make it to your "Member List" screen, simply select the youth or adult volunteer member you want to re-enroll by clicking on the "Enroll Now" next to their name. ALL adult volunteers will need to re-enroll, as well. Please edit any information that has changed. Your years in 4-H, age, and grade should have transfer correctly, but double check everything. As this is a NEW version of 4-H Online, you will have to select any and all the projects you are interested in.

Unfortunately, at this time, once you've submitted your enrollment, you won't be able to add or remove projects. If you have already completed your enrollment, and need to add more projects, go ahead and contact the Extension office.

New Enrollment: If you are adding a new youth to the family or just getting started in 4-H Online for the first time and having problems contact jschiere@illinois.edu or call the Peoria Extension office at 309-685-3140 for assistance. Remember, you will have to add at least one project to submit your enrollment.

Please remember, you will not be activated until payment is received. If the annual 4-H Program Fee causes financial hardship to your family, please contact Cathy at ludolph@illinois.edu or call the Extension office..

Publications (4-H project manuals/workbooks) are no longer part of the 4-H Online system. Please check last months newsletter for information on ordering project manuals.

YQCA and Quality Assurance – Animal Project Information

Cat, Dog, Horse, Poultry, and Rabbits

If a 4-H member is taking Cat, Dog, Horse, Poultry, or Rabbits – They are required to complete Quality Assurance and Ethics training, one time during their 4-H years. The website for that is:

Animal Science Posters or Displays at 4-H General Show

For any animal projects -- If a 4-H member is showing a poster or other display (not a live animal) at the 4-H General Show, they **DO NOT** have to do any type of ethics training. They can do it if they want to. It is still a good learning experience.

Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goat, and Dairy Cattle (with live animals as a project)

Statewide requirement is that members in these projects **must complete YQCA** – Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, in order to show and be premium eligible.

Must be done every year they are in the project. Premiums are only given to those exhibitors who complete it. State Fair entries will only be approved for those who complete it. There are two options:

1. Youth may take training individually online at any time: <http://yqca.org> – Cost for this is \$12 per person. Or
 2. Youth may attend one in-person training, approx. one hour long. If you are unable to attend on the Peoria County date you can attend in a neighboring county if they have space.
In person training for Peoria County - Wednesday, May 5, 6:30 pm at the Kickapoo Township Hall—go to <https://learngrow.io> - register with your 4-H Online information and then find the date May 5.
- Pre-registration online is required for the in-person training.
 - \$3 per person online payment ahead of time is required for an in-person training. **IMPORTANT:** Participants must pay in advance – payment cannot be made the evening of the training.
 - Adults may attend with their kids, but do not register. Adults may not be certified in this by

- Youth must have a separate bed; a separate room is not required.
- Host family selection is dependent on completion of an application and screening process, as well as student availability and personality compatibility.
