Memory Matters

As we age, it can sometimes take longer to retrieve information from long term memory, resulting in that "tip of the tongue" feeling. We say things like: What was the name of that restaurant? I can see her face but can't think of her name!

Slower recall is a normal, age-related change in memory, and the more stressed we become, the harder it can be to recall. But this doesn't mean we can't remember; it just means we can't always remember when we want to!
