

**Instructions for
Randolph County
4-H Animal Shows
General/Food Show**

Here are the details for the Randolph County 4-H Animal Shows. We will have the following classes and everyone in Randolph County will need to send 4 pictures, (1 front view, 1 side view, 1 rear view and picture on paper of your name and class of the animal), **OR** a video following the directions below. You must take a picture of a card with your name on it and what class the animal is in at the start of the video.

1. You should use a cell phone on video mode.
2. Showman should be dressed in show attire.
3. Video's should be between 45 – 60 seconds. 15 seconds per front, side and rear view
4. No editing is allowed. Should be a continuous video.
5. Phone must be held SIDEWAYS (Horizontally).
6. The Person filming should NOT move. They can twist at the waist but member should show animal to the camera as if it is the Judge.
7. There should be no sound if possible.

SMALL PET SHOW

Due June 15th by 3:00 pm

CAT

Cat I – III

Exhibit your cat. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above. The cat must be on a leash, cage or being held by exhibitor and should have been vaccinated not less than one month or more than one year before show.

DOG

Dog I - III

Exhibit your dog. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above. The dog must be on a leash, cage or being held by exhibitor and should have been vaccinated not less than one month or more than one year before show.

SMALL PETS

Small Pets I – III

Enrollment in the small pet projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or All classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Cage Birds: Exhibit one bird you have cared for. Must be confined.

Cavies (Guinea Pigs): Exhibit one cavy (Guinea Pig) you have cared for. Must be confined.

Aquatic Science: Exhibit one pair of fish in a small bowl with plastic cover. No decorative item in bowl.

Other: Check with the Extension office about exhibiting other small pets.

POULTRY

Poultry I – III

Enrollment in the Poultry projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Pen of 2 Chickens: Exhibit a cock and hen over a year.

Pen of 2 Chickens: Exhibit a cockerel and pullet under a year.

Pen of 2 Chickens: Exhibit a pair of pullets under a year.

Pen of 2 Chickens: Exhibit a pair of hens over a year.

Meat Pen – Exhibit 3 chickens, can be mixed sexes, animals must be uniform in size and ready to butcher. (Grand Champion & Grand Champion Reserve Ribbons will be awarded.)

Ducks: Exhibit one pair of ducks, either sex 1 year and older.

Geese: Exhibit one pair of geese, either sex 1 year and older.

Quails: Exhibit one pair of quails, either sex.

Pheasants: Exhibit one pair of pheasants, either sex.

Guineas: Exhibit one pair of guineas, either sex.

Turkey: Exhibit one pair of turkeys, either sex.

THIS IS A COUNTY PROJECT ONLY.

Egg Production: Exhibit one dozen eggs in carton. (Best of Show Award will be given)

RABBITS

Rabbit I – III

Enrollment in the rabbit projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Doe: One doe under 6 months.

Buck: One buck under 6 months.

Doe: One doe over 6 months.

Buck: One buck over 6 months.

Meat Pen: Pen of 3 butcher rabbits. can be mixed sexes, animals must be uniform in size and ready to butcher (Grand Champion and Grand Champion Reserve Ribbons)

HORSE SHOW

Due June 15th by 3:00 pm

HORSE

Horse I – V

Enrollment in the horse projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Halter

Animals are to be judged on conformation, type, soundness, way of moving, fitness, general balance and appearance.

Walk- Trot (under saddle)

Designed for beginner riders, exhibitors will be required to walk, trot, and back their horse.

Gaited Country Pleasure

Exhibitors will be required to exhibit walk, favorite gait, and back. This class is specifically for non-trotting, gaited horses.

Western Pleasure

Exhibitors will be required to walk, jog, lope, and back.

LIVESTOCK SHOW

Due June 15th by 3:00

BEEF

Beef I – III

Enrollment in the beef projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Beef Bull: Any breed 6 months and under.

Feeder Steer: Any Breed under 900 lbs. (not auctioning, not in final drive or rate of gain)

Beef Calf Heifer: Any breed under 6 months.

Beef Heifer: Any breed 6-12 months.

Beef Heifer: Any breed 12-18 months.

Beef Heifer: Any breed 18-24 months.

Beef Cow: Any breed.

Beef Market Steer/Heifer: Any breed.

DAIRY CATTLE

Dairy I – III

Enrollment in the dairy projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Dairy Calf: Any breed under 6 months.

Dairy Heifer: Any breed 6-12 months.

Dairy Heifer: Any breed 12-18 months.

Dairy Heifer: Any breed 18-24 months.

Dairy Cow: Any breed.

GOATS

Dairy Goat I – III

Enrollment in the goat projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Buck: Under 1 year.

Doe Kid: Under 6 months.

Yearling: 6 months to 12 months.

Non-Milking Doe: 12 months and older.

Milking Doe: 12 months and older.

Meat Goat I – III

Enrollment in the goat projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Buck: Under 1 year.

Doe Kid: Under 6 months.

Doe Kid: 6 -12 months.

Yearling: 12-24 months.

Doe: 24 months and older.

Market Wether/Doe Goat: Any breed.

Sheep I – III

Enrollment in the sheep projects listed below will enable 4-H members to qualify showing of their project in any or all classes. Please send a video or 4 pictures from directions above.

Gilt: Any breed.

Pen of Barrows: Two of any breed.

Litter: Show three pigs. At least one gilt.

Master Showmanship – if interested please contact me for an application.

ALL ANIMAL PROJECTS FOR FIRST YEAR MEMBERS:

A member in the first year of this project may prepare a display related to an activity completed in the project.

Be prepared to discuss the activity and any results. This exhibit will be shown at the General Show. Only first year Member who does not show an animal may receive a premium.

GENERAL/FOOD SHOW

Due June 30th by 3:00 pm

For all general show projects except the following: Robotics, Video and Public Presentations send me three pictures of your project.

- 1.) Picture of the whole project.
- 2.) Picture of Close up of the front of the project.
- 3.) Picture of Close up of the back of the project.
