#### ZSuite 4-H Online enrollment system: Zsuite.com

This is the main 4-H database and the website you'll use to enroll and re-enroll. Re-enrollments are due **December 1**. New Member enrollments must be in by **March 1** in order to exhibit at the county fair. It is very important that you keep track of the email and password you use to create your profile. It is also very important that you keep your contact information up-to-date. We use the contact information in this system for all mailings and emails.

#### Fair Entry: fairentry.com

This is the website where you enter classes for the fair. It will open early May and closes June 1. You must create a family profile the first time you log in to the system.

**Quality Assurance and Ethics Training (QA& E):** 4h.extension.illinois.edu/programs/animal-sciences/quality-assurance-ethics-training

All members enrolled in: Cats, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats, Dogs, Horses, Poultry, and Rabbits, are required to complete this training once in their 4-H career.

#### Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA): http://yqca.org/

YQCA is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

All youth showing the following food animals must complete this training annually or test out of age group:

Beef Cattle, Meat Goats, Sheep, Swine

#### **Risk Forms:**

All members are required to complete a lifetime risk form once in their 4-H career. Forms must be signed by a parent/guardian and turned in to club leader before member can participate in a 4-H activity.
