
Who can join 4-H?



Any person, regardless of race, color, religion, gender, national origin, ancestry, marital status, familial status, sexual orientation or disability, may enroll as a 4-H member.

- Youth who are 5 through 7 years of age on or before September 1, 2019, may enroll in a 4-H Cloverbud groups.
- Youth who are 8 years of age and have not reached their 19th birthday on or before September 1, 2019 may enroll in 4-H clubs and groups.

4-H Online Enrollment Process





- You will need to use the same email and password you used to create your family profile last year.
- From the summary screen, you will click the "Enroll for 2019-2020" button. After that , please go in an make any necessary changes (ie. Address, phone, emails, etc.)
- Pay close attention under the Participation Tab make sure correct club is listed.
- NOTE: Under the Projects portion of the Participation tab, the member will still be enrolled in the same projects from the previous year. Select any new projects, and remove any that he/she will not continue. If it is your first year in a project and you need a manual, please be sure you select that as well.
- Program Fees if you are paying for yourself please use the credit card option. Please REVIEW your credit card information (expiration date, etc.) before submitting. If your club is paying for your fee, please mark, pay by check. Our office will not accept your enrollment without payment. Dates for Enrollment



Enrollment in the 4-H program is open to individuals <u>all year</u>. However, we have the following <u>deadlines</u> that must be met regarding participation for exhibiting:

- **Re-Enrolling Members** to be eligible to participate in the 2020 4-H Shows (GPD, PP, Fair) youth must be "active" in 4-H Online, 4-H program fee paid and 4-H Liability Waiver received by our office by **NOVEMBER 1**. Members will have until April 1 to add or remove any projects.
- Beef Projects & Dairy Steer projects must be selected no later than January 1, 2020 to be eligible to exhibit.
- New Members will have until April 1, 2020 to enroll to be eligible to exhibit at the 2020 4-H Shows; however, beef and dairy steer projects will not be available to those enrolling after Jan. 1st. New members wishing to join after April 1, 2020 will be approved for participation in 4-H activities, but will not be eligible to exhibit in our 4-H Shows.

4-H PROGRAM FEE

The 4-H Program Fee of \$20 per youth will apply to all members of Community Clubs, Cloverbuds, and Special Interest Groups. Thirteen dollars will stay locally and be used by our program to help support 4-H costs. Seven dollars will be forwarded to the State 4-H program to provide educational, technical, and logistical support to maintain the 4-H program on all levels.

Two payment options:

- Paying for yourself please use the credit/debit card payment. If you have no credit card, then you may mail or drop off your \$20 fee to the office. If you have used a credit card in the past, please review the card number and expiration date. Errors with this data will cause issues within the system.
