### Shelby County 4-H Clubs receive Farm Credit Illinois Improvement Grants

Farm Credit Illinois recently awarded four community improvement grants in the amount of \$500 to Shelby County 4-H clubs. Shelby County Clubs were four of the 50 4-H clubs and FFA chapters to receive community improvement grants from Farm Credit Illinois in 2019. A total of \$25,000 in grant funds have been awarded to clubs and chapters making tangible contributions in their communities by implementing an improvement project.

Shelby County 4-H Federation used their grant money to purchase special needs swings for Forest Park. Federation also helped with the cost of the swing set frame from their own account as well as the Park District. Findlay Feeders will use their grant money to help with the Findlay Community Garden project. Shelby County Cloverbuds will be working with the Shelbyville Community Garden project. Strasburg Tailtwisters grant will be used to purchase paint so they can paint the Dairy Barn at the fairgrounds. A big thank you to FCI for sponsoring improvement grants to 4-H clubs and FFA chapters.

### 4-H & Jr. Fair Entries

Due Monday, June 3

4-H entries are on green paper and match to the green pages of the fair book. The projects listed on the fair entries are what 4-H'ers enrolled in on the 4H Online system. The Jr. Fair entries are on yellow paper and match to the yellow colored pages of the fair book. 4-H'ers need to complete a separate Jr. Fair entry for each project area. 4-H'ers also need to complete the Jr. Fair exhibitor card. 4-H'ers can exhibit any Jr. Fair project - you do not have to be enrolled in the 4-H project.

4-H entries and Jr. Fair entries should match and have corresponding projects in each fair, so make sure to complete for each fair. The following projects are 4-H only: bicycle, cats, civic engagement, collectibles, college & career readiness, communications/journalism, consumer education, 4-H exploratory, geospatial, health, intercultural, leadership, plants & soils, public speaking, reading, small pets/guinea pets, technologies, theatre arts, video/filmmaking, and weather.

Fair entries are due June 3; **no late entries!** Plan accordingly and don't wait until the last minute.

## State Fair Lamb & Goats

We will no longer host Regional sites for lamb and goat nominations for lambs and goats. Instead, exhibitors will self-nominate their lambs and goats (non-Premiere) by filling out the nomination form. You must include a close-up photo of the ear with the scrapie tag attached and readable (example on nomination form). Then the nomination form is signed by local Extension (4-H staff) and sent to the State office. Premiere wether lambs (carcass) will be nominated, tattooed (Box A), and weighed locally in each county. This must be witnessed and processed by Extension employee or whoever they designate, such as volunteer or local sheep superintendent. Please call the Extension office to set up a time. ## **Project tip sheets**

Project tip sheets have been posted to the website for various visual arts projects. If you're not sure what a project is supposed to include, you can refer to the tip sheets for help. More tip sheets will be added as they are completed. This is your first resource to assist in explaining the project and its' requirements.

## Leasing animals

Leasing animals as 4-H projects is allowed. However, the following needs to be kept in mind: the animal should be cared for by the 4-H member, and prepped and ready for exhibit by the 4-H member.

If the 4-H member isn't able to care for the animal him— or herself, then other projects should be considered.



#### Online ethics certification required for everyone taking 4-H animal projects First year animal exhibitors - take note!

All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online **Quality Assurance and Ethics course** one time in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area. The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine. Members who don't complete the certification by the June 1 deadline will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. The local office has a list of those already certified. Go to go.illinois.edu/4Hqaec. This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits. June 1 is the deadline!

## Tell your story. Win \$50

Everyone has a 4-H story. Now, you can win \$50 for telling yours! Winners statewide will be selected and their 4-H story used in 2020. Here is everything you need to know.

- Your video should be no longer than 90 seconds.
  - Your video should relate to one of these topics: Through 4-H, I've been able to ... In my 4-H XXXXX project, I've learned .....
    4-H has taught me to care about my community. I've ...
    4-H has helped me feel welcomed by ...... I've strengthened my leadership skills through 4-H by ... In the future I want to XXXXX and here's how 4-H has helped ...
- Every video should end with "Because of 4-H, I ...... Thanks for helping me grow!" There are divisions for 4-H Members, 4-H Volunteers, and 4-H Alumni!!!!!!

Send the video file to us at <u>illinois4H@illinois.edu</u> or post it to YouTube and share the link in an email to us. Be sure to save the original file in case we need it later. Include your first name, your county, and your 4-H club name. A parent or friend can record you—you're not being evaluated on the video but on your 4-H story. Of course, the more creative the video content, the better your chance of winning. It's okay to tell your story over time. For example, you may want to show a lamb when it's born, as you work on it, then in the show ring and put all those clips together into your entry. Videos will be accepted from May 1 to August 1. Winners will be announced and shown at the Illinois State Fair. Finalists may be asked to improve or edit their video to comply with Extension 4-H guidelines before their prize is awarded.

## Get your poultry tested

The Illinois Department of Agriculture is again enforcing a clear pullorum test for all 4-H and county poultry in shows lasting longer than one day. Be sure to allow adequate time and consult with your local veterinarian. This rule does not apply to waterfowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese, per the county exhibition guidelines.
