Shooting With a Crew



Location! Location! Location!

- Scout out a few locations.
- Look and listen.



Location! Location! Location!

• Have a backup plan.



Location! Location! Location!

• Consider the lighting (early morning vs. mid-day vs. late afternoon)

Noise Considerations

 Transportation (trains, cars, buses)

Equipment
 (road construction,
 lawn mowers, fans)



Noise Considerations

- Check the weather forecast
- Avoid rain or heavy wind
- Example of heavy winds
- Repurpose footage



Sound Quality

- Face the camera and microphone.
- Speak loud and clear.
- Double-check the sound (mic batteries).



Sound Quality

- Use a microphone wind muff.
- A sock can be used as a substitute.



Sound quality

- Use voice recording app.
- Recording the audio separate.
- "Layer" audio in post-production.







 Getting the video from your phone or iPad to your computer

Box is approved – desktop and iPad




 Transfer from your iPad or phone and get it right on your desktop









