What happens in a 4-H club?

Community Clubs are open to youth ages 8-18 as of September 1. During club meetings (usually once a month), members develop leadership, communication, and life skills while making friends, having fun, and serving their community. Outside of club meetings, members independently work on projects, choosing topics that spark their interest.

Cloverbud Clubs are for children ages 5-7 as of September 1. Instead of doing projects individually, Cloverbud members do project activities as a group during club meetings.

SPeial INTERest Clubs focus on one project area, and club meetings are spent developing skills in that areas. SPIN Clubs meet for a limited number of sessions and are open to youth ages 8-18 as of September 1.
