



As usual, your county extension office will need to register youth for these events through 4HOnline by the deadline. Please complete the traditional entry forms (found at the links above) and get them to your Extension office <u>at least 2 business days prior</u> to the appropriate entry deadline.

As is standard, attendance at the state horse bowl & hippology contests requires qualification at a participant's respective regional contests. Click <u>here</u> to view maps of the counties within each region.
