- 1. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE TO ENTER.** If you do there is a chance that you will run into problems and I will not have time to help everyone that needs it.
- 2. MAKE SURE YOU ENTER YOUR PROJECTS COMPLETELY IN FAIR ENTRY BY SUBMITTING THE INVOICE.** If you do not go all the way through that process, then your project will not be entered because I will not have an invoice that I can approve. I won't even know that you have started one. If you are in doubt, please contact me to see if I have received your submissions. Once the deadline arrives, it will be too late.

LIVESTOCK PROJECTS

The deadline to complete the YQCA is July 15. If you have not completed the YQCA, your project will not be eligible for county or state showing. You can take the YQCA online: <https://yqca.learn-grow.io/Account/Login>

If you previously signed up for an in-person class, you **MUST** request a refund before you can register for the online class.

Here are the instructions to cancel a registration:

1. Go to <https://yqca.learn-grow.io> and login to the account.
2. Select the course - you will have an option to "Cancel Registration". This will cancel the training and refund the payment/re-activate the coupon code. In other words if they paid the \$3 they get it refunded or if they used a coupon then the coupon is re-activated and can be used again.

STEPS FOR ENROLLING YOUR LIVESTOCK PROJECTS

 2. Upload your videos to BOX: https://extension.illinois.edu/sites/default/files/how_to_upload_videos_to_box.pdf
 3. Register your project in Fair Entry: https://extension.illinois.edu/sites/default/files/family_instructions_to_enroll_in_exhibits.pdf
 - Make sure you select the correct link to your county BOX file.
 - Only 1 video is allowed per entry.
- Make sure you label your video with your **NAME & PROJECT**. I have to take these videos and link them to your projects in Fair Entry, which will be impossible if I don't have the 4-H member's name and the specific animal.

This week's challenge was to do something nice for Father's Day.

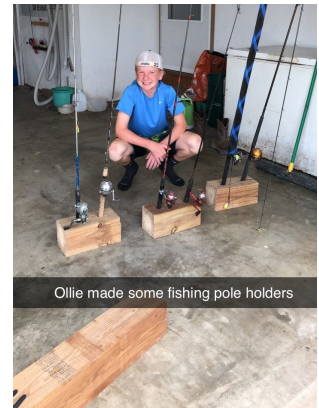


Congratulations Morgan Waller from Creative Critters! She bought her dad a shirt for Father's Day and won a set of grilling spices.

Illinois 4-H State General Project Show:

- * Youth will be able to show projects at state virtually, just as you are at the county level.
- * Youth can only take one project category to State. If multiple projects advance, you will be asked to pick one.
- * Youth may also be part of one virtual group project exhibit (leadership or intercultural).
- * You may exhibit in the virtual state public speaking contest AND another project area for the General Project Show as these are separate contests.
- * Judging will take place throughout the month of August.
- * Public viewing is mandatory in order to receive premium funds.
- * Once judging is complete, you will be able to log in for feedback.

Junior Livestock Expo:

The Department of Agriculture has announced that it will host an Expo in Springfield in September for Illinois exhibitors ages 8-21. Additional information on that opportunity will be distributed directly through the Department of Agriculture.
