

#### Meeting Guidelines during COVID



Currently we are allowed to meet in groups of 25 inside or 25% of room capacity (whichever is less) and groups of 50 outside with safety measures in place which includes wearing masks and using social distancing. I realize some of our clubs are larger than 50 so please consider alternatives such as:

- Continuing to meet using Zoom or Skype or some other virtual format.
- Splitting your meetings up into different times or days so that you can split your club numbers in half for each meeting.
- Hosting hybrid meetings where some attend in person and others attend via Zoom
  or other virtual format.
  - Finding new meeting locations that can accommodate higher numbers while meeting the guidelines mentioned above.

Whatever you decide, please make sure you are continuing to stay active in some format. We really don't want to lose our 4-H members and there are plenty of opportunities that we can provide them to keep them active in 4-H even during this pandemic.



#### National 4-H Week - October 4-10, 2020 Theme: Opportunity4ALL

National 4-H Week is our time to tell the world about 4-H. This year's theme, **Opportunity4ALL**. We are lifting up youth voices and helping kids get equal access to the resources they need to thrive. You are encouraged to find ways to celebrate October 4 – 10. 4-H Spirit Day will be held Wednesday, October 7. Encourage your clubs to show their 4-H pride and wear a clover! Use the hashtag #Opportunity4All or #National4HWeek as you share your 4-H activities on social media. We will be sharing more information in the coming weeks.

#### Inspire your club to promote 4-H during National 4-H Week

During times of COVID19, please plan accordingly to adhere to all social distancing guidelines in your area. Some face to face activities may not be feasible this year.

- Post 4-H window signs in your windows; "Proud 4-H Member or Volunteer Lives Here"
- ♦ Change your Facebook cover for National 4-H Week
- ♦ Have a day to wear a 4-H shirt to work or school. 4-H Spirt Day will be held on Wednesday!
- ♦ Join the National 4-H Week Spirit week on Illinois 4-H Facebook page.
- ♦ Use the Facebook Photo Frame to show you are a proud member of 4-H
- ♦ In a 4-H meeting or remote schooling, use the 4-H zoom backgrounds.
- Print bookmarks and ask banks to include a bookmark or flyer about 4-H at their drive-thrus.
- Share handouts or bookmarks with schools, home school organizations, and youth-serving agency boards.
- ♦ Get Social! Start a social media engagement post —What did you gain in 4-H? and distribute it to your social media channels and encourage other club members to post too.
- ♦ Post National 4H week signs, or join 4-H signs in the yards of current or past 4-H members.
- ♦ Have a poster contest with your members, then display them in local business windows.
- ♦ County Window Display Contest to have clubs host a 4-H window display in a local business.
- ♦ Write letters to your congressional leaders or local legislators about how important 4-H is to you.
- ♦ Attend a city council meeting and have the mayor/councilmen sign the Proclamation. Or have them present via Zoom or Google Meet to your 4-H Club and share on social media.
- ♦ Host a quiz night—Are You Smarter than a 4-Her?
- Promote 4-H livestock projects at the feed store.
- ♦ Promote 4-H technology projects at the electronic/phone/computer stores.
- Promote 4-H foods projects at the grocery stores.
- Promote 4-H entrepreneur projects at the banks.
- Promote 4-H family projects at the doctor offices.
- Promote 4-H on local advertising signs, billboards, church message boards.
- ◆ Take a plate of 4-H cookies to local businesses with an appreciation poster for them to post.
- Take thank you flowers to all your club leaders.
- ♦ Have a county-wide or club community service day and have the members all report back what they did, then prepare an impact story about how important 4-H service is.
- Carve pumpkins with a 4-H logo and take them to area homes, businesses or have a photo contest to see which ones get the most likes.
- Have members bring projects and speak at local civic organizational meetings.
- Plant a tree in honor of 4-H.

**Phase 1:** Dairy test relating to dairy management and facts

**Phase 2:** Skillathon: series of three learning stations with specific tasks and questions - Station 1) Feed ID; Station 2) Pedigrees; Station 3) Equipment ID.

#### **State 4-H Poultry Judging Contest**

September 12, 2020 12:30 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Illinois State Fair Grounds Springfield, Illinois

<u>Participation</u>: A county may enter any number of 4-H participants. A county team may be made up of three or four contestants with no limit on the number of teams or individuals. The scores of the three highest scoring individuals from each team will be totaled to determine each team score. All contestants will be eligible for all individual honors. The four highest senior 4-H'ers will be selected to participate on the state team. A senior 4-H'er is one who is 14-18 years of age by January 1 of the current year. The individuals that score the highest will be invited to participate in the National 4-H poultry and Egg Conference during the third week of November in Louisville, KY.

Registration: Beginning at 12:00 noon on September 12, 2020. Masks are required to be on the grounds.

<u>Classes</u>: Two (2) classes of past egg production hens, reasons will be given on one of these classes; one (1) class of ready-to cook fryers; one (1) class of broken out eggs; and two (2) classes of exterior egg quality.

Contestants will give oral reasons on one of the two past egg production classes.

Ten (10) minutes will be allowed for placing the class.
