- 1. Review Showbook Rules/Guidelines and General Projects to determine what projects you would like to exhibit, you must be enrolled in 4-H online to exhibit the project.

Project Uploads Requirements – Choose 1

- · Photos a photo of the overall exhibit (required) and 2 photos that provide a close up of a skill, technique or content area that you would like to report
- Microsoft PowerPoint or Google Slides (saved as a pdf) option is available as an alternative to creating a physical poster presentation. 10 slides. Slideshows of a maximum 20 slides are allowed for multi-year project binder/portfolio exhibits or large collection displays, including: My Financial Future: Adv., Entomology 3, RockHounds 1-2, Communications, Journalism, and Leadership 2-3.
- Video Upload of 3 minutes ONLY allowed/required robotics, computer science, video, and maker projects. Instructions on website.
- Cloverbuds requirement 1 picture and project report
- 3. Upload to Fair Entry, <u>deadline to enter is June 19</u>.
- 4. July 1 State Fair Delegates & Champions Announced
- 5. Any member that is enrolled and paid their county enrollment fee is eligible to show, the previous requirement to attend 4 events has been waived for this year.
- 6. Classes that state activities from the book are no longer required due to a virtual show, members are only required to upload the elements listed in the Virtual 2020 Fair Entry Exhibit Requirements for a judge to review. Please continue to use this show book as a starting place but refer to the Virtual Exhibit Requirements preadsheet for guidance on the new exhibit requirements.
