## Horse Ownership/Lease and ID Forms

All 4-H members planning to exhibit in Horse projects are required to complete and return proof of ownership or lease papers, photo ID of horses and copies of most recent Coggins test results. All forms and photos are due to the Tazewell Extension office by **Friday, May 13**.

Hard copies of the forms will be mailed directly to 4-H members enrolled in Horse projects. If you have any questions, you may contact the Extension office or a Horse Superintendent.

## **Lambs & Goats for Illinois State Fair**

Lambs for the 2022 Illinois State Fair Junior and Open Premiere (carcass) shows must be nominated, weighed, and tattooed between (including) March 15 and May 15, 2022 at the local county level. Please contact the Tazewell Extension office to schedule a date and time

Non-Premiere lambs and goats for state fair (those showing in the live show only)

All non-premiere lambs and goats for state fair junior show will be Self-Nominated in 2022 as follows:

- Exhibitors fill out and send in nomination form with photo of lamb's ear with scrapie tag installed in ear (closeup photo of ear so scrapie tag can be read). Nominations must be signed by local Extension Office.
- This must be completed between March 15 and May 15, 2022.
- Contact the Tazewell Extension office for the form and assistance.

## **Animal Project 4-H Policy**

4-H members enrolled in Animal projects will be emailed details on the requirements to exhibit each specie. We are still using Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification (QAEC) and Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) as the two certification programs in Illinois 4-H.

This request system will automatically email you any free, downloadable project resources when you select those items through the site.

#### Parade of Banners

All Tazewell County 4-H Clubs are invited to participate in the Parade of Banners on Tuesday, August 2. It will be right after the Livestock Parade in the Livestock Arena.

Each club may select one or two banner carriers (who are NOT in the Livestock Parade). The banner carriers should meet at 5:55 PM in the Livestock Arena to line up and receive directions.

The Parade of Banners is a great way to get 4-H members involved in the fair and leadership responsibilities. You can use it to encourage new members or members who want an easy way to be involved.

### **Superintendents Wanted!**

There are several departments in need of Superintendents. Public Speaking and Clothing & Textiles need at least one volunteer each. There is also an opening for an additional Superintendent in the Communications Department. Please let Katharine know if you are interested or know of someone who is.

### 4-H Poultry Exhibitors

IDOA has filed for emergency rule prohibiting the sale or exhibition of poultry and poultry products at Illinois events, including fair exhibitions, to prevent the spread of avian influenza. These rules will be assessed in 45-day increments and will stay in effect for up to 150 days. This would apply to 4-H shows, live animal workshops and exhibit opportunities. If live exhibitions cannot happen, your local Extension office will provide more details regarding optional exhibition opportunities.

### Risk Release Form

Is your risk and release from liability and claim form on file in the Tazewell Extension office? Well, if it's not, you will soon be receiving an email about completing one. The current form is included on the next page for your reference.

We are using one risk and release from liability and claim form for all of Extension's programs/ activities; this includes 4-H. All Extension participants (this includes all youth 4-H members) and volunteers will sign this form **JUST ONCE**, and it will be kept on file in the appropriate Extension office.

## Extension Participant/Volunteer AGREEMENT TO ASSUME RISKS AND FULLY RELEASE ALL CLAIMS



Risks of Extension Activities. I understand that my participation in University of Illinois Extension activities can present risks of physical injury (including death or disability) to me and damage to my personal property. The University of Illinois does not guarantee my personal health or safety or protect me against property loss. Physical injury to me or property damage may result from known or unexpected risks arising from things such as: use of equipment, materials, or facilities; environmental conditions, including poisonous plants, insects, and extreme heat or cold and other weather-related hazards; natural disasters; water activities; transportation; actions of others; animal behaviors; unavailability of immediate or adequate emergency care; infectious diseases; and slips and falls.

Risks of 4-H Equine Activities. Equine (horse, pony, mule, donkey, or hinny) activities present dangerous risks of injury and harm, regardless of the safety measures taken. If a horse or other equine animal is frightened or provoked, I understand that it might ignore its training and act according to its natural survival instincts, which may include actions such as unexpected change of directions or speed; running; sudden movement or stopping; shifting weight; bucking; rearing; kicking; and biting. I understand that UNDER THE ILLINOIS EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT, EACH PARTICIPANT WHO ENGAGES IN AN EQUINE ACTIVITY EXPRESSLY ASSUMES THE RISK OF ENGAGING IN AND LEGAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE INJURY, LOSS, OR DAMAGE TO PERSON OR PROPERTY RESULTING FROM THE RISK OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES. Risk of equine activities means dangers including but not limited to: (1) propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them; (2) unpredictability of an equine's reaction to sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, other animals or other things; (3) certain hazards such as surface and subsurface conditions; (4) collisions with other equines or objects; and (5) the potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, such as failing to maintain control over the animal or not acting within his or her ability.

<u>Risks of 4-H Shooting Sports Activities</u>: Shooting sports involve the use of firearms, live ammunition, or archery equipment. I understand that there are inherent dangers associated with my participation in shooting sports, including observation. The potential dangers include, among other things, gunshot or archery wounds that can result in paralysis or loss of vision, limb, or life.

Assumption of Risks and Release of Claims: In consideration for allowing me to participate in Extension activities, I voluntarily assume all risk of injury and loss that I may sustain or suffer in connection with my participation in the activities described in this Agreement, and I forever and fully release, waive, and discharge all claims, demands, actions, and causes of action, known or unknown, that I have or that may accrue to me in the future ("Claims") against the Board of Trustees of the University of Illinois, its officers, employees, agents, and volunteers (individually a "Releasee") for personal injuries (including death), damage to property, and all liabilities, losses, costs, and expenses (including attorney fees) arising out of or resulting from my participation in Extension activities, including all Claims arising, in whole or in part, from the negligence of any Releasee. This Agreement is binding on my heirs, assigns, and representatives.

<u>Effective Date:</u> This Agreement is effective on the date signed by me ("Effective Date") and replaces any similar agreements previously signed by me as to Extension activities that occur on or after the Effective Date.

## **Crop Scouting Competition**


Aug 4, 2022 - Crop Sciences Research & Education Center, 4202 South 1st St., Savoy, IL 61874


## True Leaders in Equity Institute
