Tazewell County 4-H End of the Year Club Paperwork

Due September 30, 2022

4-H Club Annual Financial Statement

All 4-H clubs with a checking or savings account must complete the 4-H Club Annual Financial Statement form at the end of each 4-H year. Submit this statement along with other required forms and officer books to the Extension office by <u>September 30.</u>

The financial statement includes a report of income and expenses for the 4-H club checking account (page 1) and/ or savings account (page 2). The club treasurer and club leader must sign on page 2 of this form to verify that the information is correct. Also on page 2, the **Fiscal Review Committee (a group of 2 or 3 youth and adults who do not have signatory rights on the club's bank account)** must review the financial records of the 4-H club for the past year and sign to indicate that they have found everything in good order.

Contact the Extension office if you need a copy of this financial statement. This is a required step from the IRS. Your club cannot be active for the new 4-H year until this is received in the Extension office.

Treasurer Book

Each 4-H Club is **required** to turn in either a completed Treasurer's Book with a completed audit form OR an Indication of Financial Activity Statement (for clubs without a treasury).



Secretary Book

All 4-H Clubs are required to turn in a Secretary book for the 2021-2022 4-H year. Books may be typed or handwritten, but must show the past year's club activities, motions, approved financial transactions (if applicable) and any other business conducted by the club.
