SHOOTING SPORTS LEADER TRAINING

Each 4-Her must re-enroll each year in order to stay active in 4-H. Enrollment fees are \$20 and can be paid through Z-Suite via credit card or at the Extension office if you prefer to pay with cash or check.

HORSE/PONY ID AND LEASE INFORMATION

Each year, 4-Hers wishing to show horses at the fair in July are required to provide proof of lease or ownership, registration papers (if applicable), and an updated Coggins Test to the Extension office by April 15. More information and forms will be sent to those enrolled in horse projects at a later date.



PREPARE FOR FAIR

NEW PROJECT LEVEL POLICY

This year when enrolling in Z-Suite, 4-Hers are only allowed one level of a project area. Members are encouraged to select a project level based on their skills in that project. The 4-H curriculum is designed to build on itself, meaning we encourage members to start at the beginning and work their way through the project levels over their 4-H career.

If you accidentally choose more than one level of a project area, Abbie or Lynda will reach out to help you decide which level is appropriate for you. If you have any questions, let them know!

LIVESTOCK OWNERSHIP

It is recommended that those planning to show livestock at the fair this year own or have leased their animals by January 1.



CLUB SPIRIT DISPLAY CONTEST

We want to celebrate and show off all of the amazing things our clubs do each year! In order to showcase these things, Lynda and Abbie are challenging each club to create a display at the 4-H Show to share what you've been up to this year. 
