## PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTEST

The Tazewell County 4-H Public Speaking contest will take place on April 1, 2025 in the Tazewell County Farm Bureau auditorium. Members enrolled in this project area will be contacted directly with details when the date gets closer. Those wishing to exhibit a Public Speaking project should make sure they are enrolled in a club and indicate their interest in that project area in Z-Suite. Those wishing to participate should also be registered in FairEntry and Z-Suite no later than 11:59 PM on Monday, March 24. More information will be sent out about how to use FairEntry in the coming week.

The Illinois State 4-H Public Speaking Contest is scheduled for April 26, 2025.

## **PROJECT MANUAL REQUESTS**

The Extension office keeps an inventory of project manuals on hand for you to request at no cost to you. Requests for manuals can be made through the form linked below or on your dashboard in Z-Suite. Once Lynda or Abbie have received your request, they will fill your request as soon as they can. After your request has been filled, one of them will email to let you know they're ready to be picked up at the Extension office. If a book is only available in a free PDF version, the request system will automatically send you a copy.

YQCA AND QAEC

Do vou plan to show an animal at this vear's fair? Make sure to **complete the appropriate trainings** by July 15, 2025 in order to show your animal at the fair this year!

4-Hers wishing to show beef, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, or goats must complete the **yearly** Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training in order to be eligible to show at the fair. There will be several opportunities to do this training in person for little to no cost. If 4-Hers would rather do the training online, they can do so at vgcaprogram.org for a fee of around \$12.

4-Hers wishing to show horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats must complete their Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification (QAEC) once in their 4-H career in order to show at the fair. This certification can be completed for free on the Clover Academy tab on Z-Suite.

## HORSE/PONY ID AND LEASE INFORMATION

Each year, 4-Hers wishing to show horses at the fair in July are required to provide proof of lease or ownership, registration papers (if applicable), and an updated Coggins Test to the Extension office by April 15. More information and forms will be sent to those enrolled in horse projects at a later date.

## **NEW PROJECT LEVEL POLICY**

This year when enrolling in Z-Suite, 4-Hers are only allowed one level of a project area. Members are encouraged to select a project level based on their skills in that project. The 4-H curriculum is designed to build on itself, meaning members are encouraged to start at the beginning and work their way through the project levels over their 4-H career. If you accidentally choose more than one level of a project area, Abbie or Lynda will reach out to help you decide which level is appropriate for you.

In order to become a volunteer, you must be 21 years of age, complete the 4-H volunteer screening, attend a field day, and complete the online module. The next Central Illinois field training day will be on May 10 in Monticello, IL at the 4-H Memorial Camp.
