Clover Clinic 2020

Mark your calendar for Saturday, February 15 for the 2020 Clover Clinic at Illinois Central College. Be sure to watch your emails or check out <u>https://go.illinois.edu/4-HCloverClinic</u> for registration and class information.

This large, regional event is held at ICC with about 30 different hands–on classes offered throughout the day. 
Livestock judging Team

Taking an animal project? You better READ THIS! For members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and



The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing

PQA, which no longer exists. **ALL** 4-H exhibitors of the above animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program each year starting for the 2020 show season.

You will need to attend either a face to face class or certify online via the website <u>http://yqca.org</u>.

The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21.

This certification is needed each year with test out options of 1-3 years.

Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H shows are no longer required to be PQA plus certified.

The estimated cost for the face-to-face training is \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

Tazewell will be offering two face to face trainings in 2020. The trainings should take about an hour and a half, and will be taught by Katharine. Youth from neighboring counties will be invited, too. **Be sure to register (with your 4-H Online credentials) through** <u>http://yqca.org</u> for your desired training date.

Tazewell Training Dates (held in the Tazewell Extension office):

Monday, Feb. 17 @ 9 a.m. May's is TBD, but will be @ 6:30 p.m.

For members enrolled in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAE) training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. If you have already taken this for one of the above animals, then you are covered.

Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the project, and will not be eligible to exhibit at county shows.

The website is open year round @ <u>http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/</u>. NOTE: Youth must use a computer for this program; not a tablet or smartphone.

Youth in multiple species will be required to take both trainings when appropriate.

Examples:

Dairy Cattle and Poultry means you would take YQCA for Dairy and QAE (if you've never taken it) for Poultry .

Horses and Poultry means you only take QAE for both species.



4-H Online Enrollment is OPEN!

It's time to enroll and re-enroll in 4-H! The enrollment process is to be completed through 4-H Online, <u>https://il.4honline.com/</u>. Here are some tips.

Re-enrollment: If you are re-enrolling, do NOT create a new profile. You will need the email address and password you created last year. If you can't remember which email you used, Katharine will look it up for you. If you forgot your password, just use the "I forgot my password" option on the login screen to reset it. Once you make it to your "Member List" screen, simply select the youth or adult volunteer member you want to re-enroll by clicking on the "edit" button next to their name. ALL adult volunteers will need to re-enroll, as well. Please edit any information that has changed. Your years in 4-H and age automatically rolled over, so you do not have to do anything with that. All of your 4-H projects from last year will still be listed, so please be sure to take the time and delete any of those you no longer wish to take. When you make it to the payment option, remember you can pay via credit, but you will have to make sure you select that option. Also, please be sure to check your credit card information from last year, as it saved that information. If your card has changed, then you will need to edit the information. Be sure to stop at the invoice screen if you are enrolling more than 4 youth, so Katharine can get the discount applied to your invoice.

New Enrollment: If you are adding a new youth to the family or just getting started in 4–H Online for the first time, contact <u>girone1@illinois.edu</u> or 309–347–6614 for assistance. Remember, you will have to add at least one project to submit your enrollment.

Please remember, you will not be activated until payment is received. Also, if you need the project manual, remember to select it from the dropdown bar when you select your projects. To be eligible to exhibit in the Tazewell 4-H Show, your enrollments are DUE MARCH 1!

Getting a jump on the 4-H dog project!

Explore the nation's capital

For over 50 years, thousands of 4-H members have traveled to Washington, DC to participate in Citizenship Washington Focus, a life-changing week that empowers 4-Hers to take their leadership skills to the next level for themselves and their communities. The trip is July 4-11, 2020. You must be at least 14 by May 1, 2020. During the week, you will explore the federal legislative process through workshops and hands-on sessions, tour historical sights and museums, give your voice on issues, visit federal legislative offices, and meet teens from other states. The 2020 cost is estimated to be \$1,305, with financial assistance being provided from the Illinois 4-H Foundation. Registration deadline is Friday, Jan. 3. Register at go.illinois.edu/4HCWF.

Understanding copyright and trademark laws

When an author, musician, designer, or artist creates something, it is immediately protected by copyright or trademark laws and other people can't use it or create something similar. Original works such as stories, music, pictures, plays, dances, sculpture, movies, and architecture are protected. 4–H members should use caution when working on a speech, display, or exhibit so you don't use something that doesn't belong to you.

4-H members can't draw or copy someone else's design, logo, words, or music without the permission of the original owner. That means, you can't draw a logo (such as Ford or John Deere) and use it on your exhibit. You can't create Mickey Mouse ears on your cake. You can't draw a Disney princess. You can't put SpongeBob image on your natural resource project exhibit board.

Think of it like this. You wouldn't take your neighbor's bike and ride it around to make your life easier without getting permission first. That would be stealing. When you take words, art, graphics, or photographs that aren't yours but use them like they are, that's stealing, too. Copying them from the internet is the same as stealing them unless you are using a site specifically created for free use of images.
