IMPORTANT TAZEWELL 4-H DEADLINES

MARCH 1, 2020: 4-H GENERAL ENROLLMENT —

Anyone planning to enroll in the Tazewell 4-H program must complete their online Enrollment and pay their program fee by March 1 in order to be eligible to register for the 4-H Show exhibit opportunity. ALL projects must be selected at this time! Use the 2019-2020 Project Guide to enroll.

APRIL 15, 2020: HORSE & PONY ID & LEASE FORMS —

Tazewell County 4-H members planning to exhibit their horse/pony at the 4-H Show and Jr. Fair are required to complete an ID form and Ownership or Lease papers and turn in a copy of their current Coggins test to the Extension office by April 15. Packets will be mailed out to members after March 1.

JUNE 15, 2020: 4-H SHOW REGISTRATION — ALL

Tazewell County 4-H members planning on exhibiting at the 2020 Tazewell 4-H Show & Jr. Fair will need to register for their eligible exhibit opportunities by June 15.

Taking an animal project? You better READ THIS!



For members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats:

The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA, which no longer exists. ALL 4-H exhibitors of the above animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program each year starting for the 2020 show season.

You will need to attend either a face to face class or certify online via the website <http://yqca.org>.

The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21.

This certification is needed each year with test out options of 1-3 years.

Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H shows are no longer required to be PQA plus certified.

The estimated cost for the face-to-face training is \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

Tazewell will be offering two face to face trainings in 2020. The trainings should take about an hour and a half, and will be taught by Katharine. Youth from neighboring counties will be invited, too. **Be sure to register (with your 4-H Online credentials) through <http://yqca.org> for your desired training date.**

Notify Katharine if you opt to attend another county's training.

For members enrolled in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAE) training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. If you have already taken this for one of the above animals, then you are covered.

Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the project, and will not be eligible to exhibit at county shows.

The website is open year round @ <http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/>. **NOTE:** Youth must use a computer for this program; not a tablet or smartphone.

Youth in multiple species will be required to take both trainings when appropriate.

Examples:



Dairy Cattle and Poultry means you would take YQCA for Dairy and QAE (if you've never taken it) for Poultry .

Horses and Poultry means you only take QAE for both species.

Aim high for the Illinois State

Fair

Make plans now to attend the Illinois State Fair. The 4-H General Project Show will be three days, Aug. 14-16 in Springfield. Tazewell's exhibit day is August 14.

4-H Online Enrollment is OPEN!

It's time to enroll and re-enroll in 4-H! The enrollment process is to be completed through 4-H Online, <https://il.4honline.com/>. Here are some tips.

Re-enrollment: If you are re-enrolling, do NOT create a new profile. You will need the email address and password you created last year. If you can't remember which email you used, Katharine will look it up for you. If you forgot your password, just use the "I forgot my password" option on the login screen to reset it. Once you make it to your "Member List" screen, simply select the youth or adult volunteer member you want to re-enroll by clicking on the "edit" button next to their name. ALL adult volunteers will need to re-enroll, as well. Please edit any information that has changed. Your years in 4-H and age automatically rolled over, so you do not have to do anything with that. All of your 4-H projects from last year will still be listed, so please be sure to take the time and delete any of those you no longer wish to take. When you make it to the payment option, remember you can pay via credit, but you will have to make sure you select that option. Also, please be sure to check your credit card information from last year, as it saved that information. If your card has changed, then you will need to edit the information. Be sure to stop at the invoice screen if you are enrolling more than 4 youth, so Katharine can get the discount applied to your invoice.

New Enrollment: If you are adding a new youth to the family or just getting started in 4-H Online for the first time, contact girone1@illinois.edu or 309-347-6614 for assistance. Remember, you will have to add at least one project to submit your enrollment.

Please remember, you will not be activated until payment is received. Also, if you need the project manual, remember to select it from the dropdown bar when you select your projects. To be eligible to exhibit in the Tazewell 4-H Show, your enrollments are DUE MARCH 1!

Compete in regional horse contests and earn your trip to state!

There are several ways to learn about horses, and you don't even need a horse! If you are interested in competing in 4-H Horse Bowl and/or 4-H Hippology Contest, be sure to check out the Horsin' Around SPIN Club. The State 4-H Horse Bowl Contest is **Sunday, April 19** at the Education Building on the U of I campus. The State 4-H Hippology contest is **Saturday, April 18** in the David Kinley Hall on the U of I campus. Our regional contest is April 4 at Lincoln Land Community College in Springfield.

4-H HORSE SPEAKING CONTEST:

4-H Horse Speaking contests help you gain self-confidence, courage and persuasiveness; share ideas with others; and develop the ability to speak in public to inform others about horse-related subjects and the 4-H Horse project. Compete in the formal, team, or presentation division. Learn more @ <http://4h.extension.illinois.edu/events/illinois-4-h-horse-speaking-contest>. The state 4-H Horse Speaking Contest is **Saturday, April 18** at the David Kinley Hall on the U of I campus, 10 a.m. Any 4-H members may participate, and no pre-qualifying is needed. Register at the Extension office by mid-March. Cost is \$3 per entry.

Don't be chicken; hop on over

Learn to show poultry and rabbits from one of the leading Illinois 4-H judges, Mike Claypool. The workshop is open to any 4-H members, and there is no cost. It's 'udderly' amazing!

February 29 | East Peoria

You don't need a cow. You don't need to like milk (though you should REALLY like milk). You don't need to be taking a dairy project. All you need to compete in the State 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl Contest is a desire to do it. (You would probably do better if you study, too.)

The state contest is Saturday, Feb. 29 at the Embassy Suites, East Peoria Riverfront Hotel & Conference Center. Registration is prior to the quiz bowl test which begins at 11:30 a.m. The contest rounds begin at 1 p.m., and the contest will be completed by 5 p.m. County Extension staff must register participants before Feb. 14.

Questions will cover all aspects of dairy production and marketing. Study reference sources include the Illinois 4-H dairy manuals plus *Hoard's Dairyman Reference Books*, *IL Extension Livestock E-Quiz website*, *Holstein Foundation website*, and *Virginia 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl study materials online*.

Teams of four may compete, or individuals can be added to other groups to form a team. The State 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl team will be selected from the eligible 4-H members participating at this state contest. Youth 15 to 18 are eligible for the national team.

Get your Clover at JOANN stores

Between March 1 and April 30, you can donate to 4-H at your local JOANN store. Purchase either a \$1 or \$4 Clover for Kids at the register. \$4 clovers have a coupon for \$4 off your next visit to the store.

Selection is based on the total number of family members with 4-H connections, the total number of years of 4-H involvement, the diversity of experiences and recognitions earned by the 4-H members, and the collective impact that family members have made as advocates of their county and state 4-H programs. Interns must attend the mandatory orientation, currently scheduled for May 22-30, 2020 as well as additional trainings throughout the year (as required). Following orientation, interns may work 1-2 weekends a month, however interns must commit to a minimum of one weekend per month (Fri-Sun) for the duration of the internship. Understanding copyright and trademark laws

When an author, musician, designer, or artist creates something, it is immediately protected by copyright or trademark laws and other people can't use it or create something similar. Original works such as stories, music, pictures, plays, dances, sculpture, movies, and architecture are protected. 4-H members should use caution when working on a speech, display, or exhibit so you don't use something that doesn't belong to you.

4-H members can't draw or copy someone else's design, logo, words, or music without the permission of the original owner. That means, you can't draw a logo (such as Ford or John Deere) and use it on your exhibit. You can't create Mickey Mouse ears on your cake. You can't draw a Disney princess. You can't put a SpongeBob image on your natural resource project exhibit board.

Think of it like this. You wouldn't take your neighbor's bike and ride it around to make your life easier without getting permission first. That would be stealing. When you take words, art, graphics, or photographs that aren't yours but use them like they are, that's stealing, too. Copying them from the internet is the same as stealing them unless you are using a site specifically created for free use of images.

Explore the nation's capital

For over 50 years, thousands of 4-H members have traveled to Washington, DC to participate in Citizenship Washington Focus, a life-changing week that empowers 4-Hers to take their leadership skills to the next level for themselves and their communities. The trip is July 4-11, 2020. You must be at least 14 by May 1, 2020. During the week, you will explore the federal legislative process through workshops and hands-on sessions, tour historical sights and museums, give your voice on issues, visit federal legislative offices, and meet teens from other states. The 2020 cost is estimated to be \$1,305, with financial assistance being provided from the Illinois 4-H Foundation. Registration deadline is Wednesday, Jan. 29. Register at go.illinois.edu/4HCWF.
