# Look for these changes at the Illinois State Fair

With the timing of the state fair and the anticipated start of school, the 4-H General Project Show at the state fair has been condensed to three days: Aug. 14, 15, and 16. Our exhibit day is Friday, August 14.

- Exhibits must be in place by 9:30 AM and remain on display until 4 PM. (new release time)
- The awards will include **Champion Medals** for the highest score in each project class and **Reserve Medals** for the second highest score in each class. Cash premiums from the state will be paid to the medal winners. **Innovation Awards** will be given to exhibits judges find inspiring, innovative, or creative and are not based on scores. *Medal winners cannot receive the innovation award in 2020.*
- New projects at the state fair include: Child Development, Leather, Sports Nutrition, Family Heritage, and Shooting Sports
- The State 4-H Public Speaking Contest will be held at the same time as the state fair. Youth can compete in a speech and also bring a project to the General Project Show. Youth must be selected in their county contest to advance and will speak the same day as their county exhibit day.
- **Ewe lambs** are now eligible for the premier show.
- The junior poultry show begins Monday, Aug.
   17.
- The **State 4-H Poultry Judging Contest** will be held at the state fair on Monday, Aug. 17.
- The **junior rabbit show** begins August 17.

### IMPORTANT 4-H REMINDER

A youth who enrolls in a 4-H club must maintain an active status with their club by attending meetings, tours, workshops, or other activities of that club to be called a 4-H member. Youth that do not comply are not eligible to take part in 4-H exhibitions, receive 4-H premiums, or other 4-H awards and recognitions that are available to 4-H members.

### **Free Baby Chicks**

# You be the judge at Illinois 4-H State Livestock Judging Contest

June 15 | 9 AM - 4 PM Stock Pavilion | University of Illinois, Urbana

The Illinois 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held Monday, June 15 at the Stock Pavilion in Urbana (1402 West Pennsylvania Ave.) beginning with registration at 8:30 a.m. All participants must be checked in by 9:30. The contest will begin at 10. Each county may enter a total of three teams, with no more than two junior teams or two senior teams. Get all the rules and details online @ go.illinois.edu/4Hlivestock. There will be three classes of beef, three classes of swine and two classes of sheep. There may also be a class of meat goats substituted for one class of the other species. There will also be a class of 15 questions (5 from a beef class, 5 from a swine class and 5 from a sheep class). Cost for each senior competitor is \$10 to cover the cost of lunch. Juniors will be dismissed by lunch to get their own meals.

**Get your Clover at JOANN stores:** Between March 1 and April 30, you can donate to 4-H at your local JOANN store.


### Foundation Hall of Fame Ceremony set

# Taking an animal project? You better READ THIS!



#### For members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats:

The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA, which no longer exists. **ALL** 4-H exhibitors of the above animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program each year starting for the 2020 show season.

You will need to attend either a face to face class or certify online via the website <a href="http://yqca.org">http://yqca.org</a>.

The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21.

This certification is needed each year with test out options of 1-3 years.

Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H shows are no longer required to be PQA plus certified.

The estimated cost for the face-to-face training is \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

Tazewell will be offering two face to face trainings in 2020. The trainings should take about an hour and a half, and will be taught by Katharine. Youth from neighboring counties will be invited, too. Be sure to register (with your 4-H Online credentials) through <a href="http://yqca.org">http://yqca.org</a> for your desired training date.

Notify Katharine if you opt to attend another county's training.

Thursday, May 7 @ 6:30 p.m.

#### For members enrolled in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAE) training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. If you have already taken this for one of the above animals, then you are covered.

Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the project, and will not be eligible to exhibit at county shows.

The website is open year round @ <a href="http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/">http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/</a>. **NOTE:** Youth must use a computer for this program; not a tablet or smartphone.

Youth in multiple species will be required to take both trainings when appropriate. Examples:



Dairy Cattle and Poultry means you would take YQCA for Dairy and QAE (if you've never taken it) for Poultry .

Horses and Poultry means you only take QAE for both species.

#### REMINDER...

Your 4-H Program Fee must be paid before you are accepted as a member!!

You may pay via card through 4-H Online, but you will need to change the default payment option from check to credit card. *Make sure your card information is up-to-date, or the payment will be declined.* Remember to select the added card to lock in this payment method.

You may also mail or drop off your payment to the Tazewell Extension office. If your profile still says, "Pending", then it is because payment is missing.

Payment will need to be received by April 1.
