YQCA Training

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals is a required annual training for 4-H youth exhibiting beef, sheep, goats, swine, and dairy projects. This requirement does not apply to poster projects, horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, or cats (although those members must still complete the online QAEC training – only once).

To Complete the Certification

- 1. Visit http://yqca.org/ and Click on Sign In/Register
- 2. Under 4-H Online Sign In, click on sign in with 4-H Online
- 3. Select Illinois 4-H Youth Development
- 4. Put in your e-mail address and password
- 5. Select Courses
- 6. Select Course List Make sure the member tab is selected
- 7. Choose a Course by member age.
- 8. Two Certification Options:
- Online Completed at home by the member \$12

Instructor Led Training - \$3

9. Search by State

- 10. Select Training example: University of Illinois Extension Saline County
- 11. Purchase Course

If you choose to attend in person there will be two opportunities. One will be at the Saline County Fairgrounds on April 24 from 2-3:00 p.m. with a limit of 50. (If this fills up they will offer another one from 3-4:00 p.m.) If you choose this one the Saline County Stockmen's Association will refund the \$3.00 fee.

There will be another face to face opportunity on May 1 from 9-10:00 am at the White County Fairgrounds. This one will cost \$3.00. Please let us know which one you plan to attend.

You must register and pay online following the instructions above to attend the in-person trainings. No walkins allowed—no fees can be paid at the event.

Online Ethics Certification Required for 4-H

Animal Projects



All 4-H members enrolled in an animal project area are required to complete the online Quality Assurance and Ethics course one time in order to stay enrolled in an animal project area.

The certification must be done if you are enrolled in one of the following projects: beef, dairy, cats, dogs, goats, horses, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine. Members

who don't complete the certification before the show will be removed from the project and not be allowed to show. Anyone who has already taken the certification does not need to retake the test. The local office has a list of those already certified. The website is located online at: http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/. This rule applies to 4-H members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits. **Deadline June 1, 2021**.
