Farm Follies Fun Awaits



We have spots for TEN Illinois 4-H teens to participate. National Congress Application will be used to select the ten Illinois teens. The Illinois 4-H Foundation has secured scholarship funds for the 10 selected delegates.

Cost – The total cost this year is \$2,000 per participant. Selected youth will receive a \$1,500 scholarship to the event provided by Illinois 4-H. They are responsible for the remaining \$500 balance which must be paid prior to the event.

Illinois State Fair

Hamilton County 4-H will exhibit projects on Sunday, August 15. If your project was selected to advance, you MUST contact the office by July 7 to let us know you want to exhibit at the state fair. Detailed information will be given to those who choose to exhibit.

However, here are some highlights:

In the past, the Extension office was able to order parking passes and advance admission tickets. We are no longer able to order parking passes. This year, we are choosing not to order advance admission tickets. Our exhibit day is a Sunday—admission at the gate on that day is \$5 so there is no savings in ordering in advance.

We are able to order load/unload passes—these are free. When you let the office know that you plan to exhibit, let us know at that time if you need a load/unload pass ordered for you.
