SPRINGFIELD, Ill. – Judging contests help kids improve their decision-making skills while teaching them to defend those decisions by giving voice to their reasoning. Poultry judging teaches standards of poultry and egg production to ensure a safe and nutritious consumer product. Youth from across Illinois gathered for the Illinois 4-H State Poultry Judging Contest held Aug. 10 in conjunction with the Illinois State Fair.



Participants compete in classes of past egg production hens, ready-to-cook fryers, ready-to-cook poultry parts, broken out eggs, shell eggs, and exterior egg quality.

In the junior division, top placings went to Lydia Worsham, Macon County, first; Anna Wier, DuPage County, second; Kari Wier, DuPage County, third; Gracie Walker, Hamilton County, fourth; Beth Schurers, Will County, fifth; Abby Henning, Will County, sixth; Charlotte Wilson, LaSalle County, seventh; Nathanael Vickery, Kendall County, eighth; and Korra Wilson, LaSalle County, ninth.

In the senior division, top placings went to Rachel Dickson, Kendall County, first; Madison Glenn, Kendall County, second; Faustina Krysciak, Kendall County, third; Julia Muschetto, Will County, fourth; and Matthew Selucky, Will County, fifth.

The four highest senior 4-H members will be selected to participate on the state team. The individuals that score the highest will be invited to participate in the National 4-H Poultry and Egg Conference in Louisville, KY.

Nine 4-H members from Hamilton County exhibited at this year's Illinois State Fair.

The best of the best award-winning 4-H members from across Illinois competed at the county level before advancing to the state level to compete in the 4-H General Project Show held August 12 at the

Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield. Exhibitors could qualify for grand champion, reserve champion, or an inspire award in their project area. Youth can compete in the same area they have exhibited in in the past, or choose a new area.

Aydan Hood, 15 year-old Hamilton County 4-H member placed first to claim the grand champion title in the Robotics 2 project area and his sister 12 year-old Emma Hood received grand champion in Video Innovation Class.

Their younger brother 9 year-old Corbyn Hood earned reserve champion in Robotics 1 Intermediate. 15 year-old Shiloh Willis received reserve champion with her Advanced Food Decorating and 13 year-old Gracie Walker earned herself reserve champion with her Electricity 2 project.

10 year-old Nola Launius was awarded the Inspire Award in Beginning Shopping in Style project. Inspire Award winners occupy a special category of "judge's choice," and signified that the project inspired the judge in some way.

2023 Junior Leadership Conference

The Illinois 4-H Junior Leadership Conference (JLC) is a fun-filled event which provides junior high 4-H members (7th & 8th grades) a look into opportunities in Illinois 4-H and helps start their leadership journey. Members gain skills related to 4-H projects and leadership, such as communication, decision making, and teamwork while engaging in hands-on activities.

Cost: \$200 (lodging, t-shirt, meals, conference supplies and activities)

Registration deadline: October 13, 2023

Registration is limited to the first 100 youth who register.

Participants are encouraged to register early as this conference usually reaches capacity before the registration deadline. A waitlist will be activated once capacity is reached.

How to register: Participants may visit the Jr. Leadership Conference website to register.

Required forms: All forms will be included in the online registration form.

Scholarships: Scholarship funds are available for 4-H member attendees who need financial assistance in order to attend. To apply, fill out the information requested on the conference registration. Your spot will be saved until we contact you regarding your scholarship status. We appreciate the support of the Illinois 4-H Foundation for providing these scholarships.

Payment options during registration:

Members pay on their own by credit card at the time of registration.

My County is Paying. Some (not all) counties may be able to assist with the registration fee. Members need to check with local extension staff prior to registration. A list will be sent to counties prior to the conference to verify that county will pay.

Scholarship needed. Members will apply directly during the conference registration process.

Counties Supplementing or Paying for Registration Fee:

Counties may pay for the entire registration fee by doing a transfer of funds form and contacting Karen Bickers, kbickers@illinois.edu to complete that process.

If county is paying for only a portion of the registration fee, counties need to collect any remaining amount of the registration fee directly from families. Families may register their member and select the 'county is paying' option.

Cancellations & Refunds: Cancellations made by Oct. 1, 2023 will receive a full refund. Please let us know if you cannot attend so that we may let someone on the waiting list have the opportunity to experience this event. No refunds will be issued for cancellations received after Oct. 1, 2023 as event supplies have already been ordered. All cancellations and refund requests must be received in writing to the State 4-H Office by emailing Carla Blue, blue1@illinois.edu.




National 4-H Week Activities

4-H can be!


Chips, drinks, and desserts will be provided. We are asking families to bring hot dogs and buns for your own family. Also, please bring wiener roast sticks if you have them.
