Enrollment/Re-Enrollment Instructions for youth/adult re-enrollments: Go to <u>http://v2.4honline.com</u> .

- Enter your email address and password.
- Click Sign-In.
- Continue to Youth and Cloverbud Member Enrollment to re-enroll youth members, continue to Adult Enrollment to reenroll Adult members.
- If you are returning to 4-H, your member record will be listed on the family Member List.
- Click "Enroll Now" under the Program in which you would like to enroll.
- Follow through each page to complete your enrollment.
- If you have forgotten your password, click "Reset Password?" to receive an email with a link to set a new password.

Illinois 4-H has a maximum per family enrollment fee of \$60. Based on this amount, the first three youth members in a family would be expected to pay \$20 per member. For the fourth member and beyond, the fee would be waived. For the fourth member and beyond, please select check as the payment method. As an FYI Illinois 4-H has been experiencing quite a lot of credit cards being declined by 4-H Online. Families who have paid with a credit card in the past should delete their credit card information before trying to re-enroll members

You may pay by credit card or check when enrolling online. If paying by check, please make the check payable to University of Illinois Extension. Please make sure you enroll in Pope-Hardin County.
