## Beef Weigh In



The Saline County Beef Weigh-In will be held on **Saturday**, **February 5th** at **1 pm** at the Fairgrounds. Beef exhibitors who want to participate in the Beef Rate of Gain Contest should plan to attend.

4-H members who plan to take a **market steer** to the Illinois State Fair are required to have the animal electronically tagged. Contact the Extension office if you will need an e-tag.

#### **QAEC Certification**

**Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training is mandatory for all Horse, Rabbit, Poultry, Cat, and Dog exhibitors. QAEC training is only required once in the member's career and is offered free of charge. \*\*\*Important News\*\*\*

**Swine** - 840 tags may be substituted for A tags or B tags in Swine Projects. If they are being used in place of A tags (at weigh-in) the 840 tag must be in the animal's ear prior to weigh-in. If they are being used in place of B tags, the 840 tag must be placed in the ear and the number reported to the Extension office within 10 days of the weigh-in.

**Goats** - Wethers born September to February must be banded or castrated by weigh-in. March-born wethers must be banded or castrated by May 31 and reported to the Goat Superintendent.

All bucks born in April to fair must show in breeding buck classes.

#### Livestock Judging/Clinic/Skill-a-thon and YQCA

Are you interested in livestock, meeting new people who share your interests, and increasing your livestock knowledge? Mark your calendars for a day of fun hands-on learning and competition on **Saturday, March 19** at **Circle H Cattle Company**, **21228 State Route 242 Dahlgren, IL 62828**.

Registration begins at 9:00 a.m. and the clinic starts at 9:30.

The day will include judging rings, livestock demonstrations, feed ingredient identification, breed identification, equipment identification and YQCA training. A \$5.00 fee payable the day of the event will register each member in all classes except the YQCA training. Youth **MUST** preregister for YQCA online at a cost or \$3. Throughout the day members will complete the face to face YQCA training.

Prizes will be awarded in several categories in both junior and senior divisions. Lunch will be provided by Farm Credit.

### **YQCA Certification**

Attention Beef Cattle, Swine, Dairy Cattle, Goat, and Sheep Exhibitors!

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animals** certification (YQCA). This statewide certification is the industry-standard and must be completed annually. **Youth MUST complete this training prior to the Saline County 4-H livestock shows.** This does not apply to youth exhibiting animal or veterinary science poster projects.

Youth have two options to be certified. Youth may attend a certification program hosted by the Extension office and pay \$3, or youth may complete the training online and pay \$12.

An in-person YQCA training is scheduled for Saturday, April 23rd beginning at 2 pm (or immediately following the Lamb/Goat Weigh-in) at the Saline County Fairgrounds

Livestock Building.

To Complete the Certification for either face-to-face training or online training:

- 1. Visit http://yqca.org/ and Click on Sign In/Register
- 2. Under 4-H Online Sign In, click on sign in with 4-H Online
- 3. Select Illinois 4-H Youth Development
- 4. Put in your e-mail address and password
- 5. Select Courses
- 6. Select Course List Make sure the member tab is selected
- 7. Choose a Course by member age.
- 8. Two Certification Options:

Online – Completed at home by the member - \$12 Instructor Led Training - \$3

- 9. Search by State
- 10. Select Training example: University of Illinois Extension Hamilton County or Saline County
- 11. Purchase Course

Note: You may have to sign out of the YQCA web site and log-in again to register the next child.

If you do not sign up through 4-HOnline, you will need to furnish our office with verification of training (print the certificate and bring it in to the office).

Our office can track your completion of training if you sign up through 4-HOnline.





#### February is Black History Month

Who was the first Extension agent in the U.S.? Thomas Monroe Campbell, better known as T.M. Campbell was the first Cooperative Extension agent at the first U.S. Cooperative Extension program at Tuskegee University. Booker T. Washington and George Washington Carver, a science professor, petitioned the USDA to appoint Campbell as an Extension agent. He got his official offer on November 12, 1906. His first job was to educate farmers in advance farming and land management methods. By 1908, he was promoted to district agent for Alabama and bordering states, training at farmer conferences and agriculture fairs. By 1914 and the passing of the Smith-Lever Act, Campbell had assisted 11 southern states in appointing black farm and home demonstration agents. He continued to have numerous leadership roles in his life and was supportive of Cooperative Extension.

#### Well It's Groundhog Day...Again...

Groundhog Day is February 2nd. What do you know about the history of Groundhog Day?

As early as 1886, German immigrants in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania observed Groundhog Day and established the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club in 1899.

According to folklore, if the hibernating groundhog - known as Punxsutawney Phil - leaves his burrow on February 2 and sees its shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter. The legend is based on a European custom predicting the length of winter by weather conditions on Candlemas, an ancient Christian festival.

#### **Valentines - According to the History Channel**

In addition to the United States, Valentine's Day is celebrated in Canada, Mexico, the UK, France, and Australia. By the middle of the 18th Century, it was common for friends and lovers of all social classes to exchange small tokens of affection or handwritten notes, and by 1900 printed cards began to replace written letters due to improvement in printing technology.



Americans probably began exchanging hand-made valentines in the early 1700's. In the 1840's, Esther A. Howland began selling the first mass-produced Valentines in America. Howland, known as the "Mother of the Valentine", made elaborate creations with real lace, ribbons and colorful pictures, known as "scrap".

Today, according to the Greeting Card Association, an estimated 145 million Valentine's Day cards are sent each year, making Valentine's Day the second largest card-sending holiday of the year (after Christmas).
