2021 Livestock Ownership Deadlines

Birth, Ownership and Tattoo Dates for Illinois State Fair Junior Show and White County. If you are interested in State Fair, please ask for more specific guidelines.

STEERS & MARKET HEIFERS:

- Calved on or after January 1, 2020

- Owned & personally cared for by exhibitor since - February 1, 2021

- Tattooed & Tagged -

o On or between the last Saturday in January (January 30, 2021) and February 28, 2021.

Beef weigh-in is February 6. (All Male & Females will be weighed and/or tagged)

o In addition to tattooing, steers that will be going to state fair are to be tagged with the electronic ID tags.

BARROWS:

- Regular Barrows

o Farrowed on or after January 1, 2021 and must be the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2021.

Swine weigh-in is March 27 @ 9am @ the Fairgrounds

(All Male & Females will be weighed and/or tagged)

- Premiere Barrows

o Farrowed on or after February 10, 2021 and must have been the property of the exhibitor by June 1, 2021

- o Weighed and Tattooed February 10 to April 15, 2021
- o Tattooed within 35 days of birth and not weigh more than 1.0lbs/day of age

o Junior exhibitors can purchase nominated barrows

SHEEP WETHERS:

- Both Premiere & Live Show Wethers

o Lambed on or after January 1, 2021

o Ownership Date – May 15, 2021

o Weighed, Tattooed & Tagged – between March 15 and May 16, 2021.



Sheep & Goat weigh-in is May 1 @ 8:00am @ Fairgrounds.

(All Male & Females will be weighed and/or tagged)

- Weigh/Tattoo procedures for Open & Jr. Premiere & Live Show Wethers:

All lambs and meat goats to be exhibited at the State Fair MUST be taken to one of the statewide locations for weighing and tattooing. Each lamb will be tagged with an electronic ID tag, tattooed, weighed, and recorded on Lamb Nomination Forms from Dan Jennings.

Specific information regarding each of the weigh-in locations & procedures will be forthcoming.

MEAT GOATS

- Wethers Born on or after October 1, 2020
- Tattooed in name of exhibitor only by May 15, 2021
- Ownership dates for Kids & Yearlings not in milk May 15, 2021

Re-certification required for youth exhibiting livestock

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animal** certification (YQCA). This program is the industry-standard certification. Check with local offices about completing the training.

The training must be completed each year. <u>http://yqca.org</u>

Horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats will still be required to take the **Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training. This training is only required once in the member's career. http://web.extension.illinois.edu/gaec/

A face to face training is still hopefully an option in the Spring, but if you choose to take and complete before March 1 the Support Committee will pay 50% of the 12.00 fee after completion!

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URBANA, Ill. – Families across Illinois have more food on their table, and youth are leading the way. 4-H is investing in the next generation of food access leaders with a first round of Food Advocacy Grants aimed at helping youth become food advocates right in their own communities.

The grants provide financial support to youth-led projects aimed at increasing food security throughout Illinois. "We are giving particular attention to funding projects that are addressing food security in areas where food access is of greatest concern, particularly rural areas," says Mark

Becker, Illinois 4-H food systems specialist. "The goal of the grant is to create a network of youth leaders around the state who have real world experience conducting impactful service projects that shift the conversation around food insecurity in Illinois."

The grant initiative creates a network of youth leaders around Illinois who are personally invested in creating food security in their community. "These grants are designed to help young people take action on issues that really matter to them," Becker says. "Youth aren't often given the opportunity to experience grant work, and this was so exciting to see them stepping up and participating."

Another round of grants is slated for late spring and Becker hopes to reach a more geographically diverse applicant pool in areas heavily impacted by food insecurity. Educators interested should contact Becker at mbbecker@illinois.edu.

In this first round, 11 winners from nine counties were chosen.

Winners include: Community Garden, DeKalb County; Fun With Food, Williamson County; **COVID Care A Lots, White County;** Suppers for Security, Cook County; Micro Food Pantry, Williamson County; Micro Pantry, Will County; Freezing Out Hunger, Macoupin County; Hands to Larger Service, Shelby County; Weekend Backpack Food Program, Montgomery County; Nosh Packs Nutrition Bags for Kids, Adams County; Bags of Hope, Will County.

We would like to congratulate Katelyn Allen for being one of the eleven winners chosen during this first round.

Katelyn's project is titled Covid - Care A Lots. Her main goal is to deliver food baskets to the people in her community. She would do so by putting nutritious food in these baskets to help them continue to get the nutrition the families need. Her goal in this project is to distribute 25-30 baskets to families in the community.

During the month of February let's help Katelyn by donating non-perishable/canned goods to add to her goal! These items can be placed in the container under the bench located outside of the Extension Office in Carmi.

4-H Project Grants Available



The White County Farm Bureau is pleased to sponsor the 2021 4-H Project Grant Program for White County 4-Hers.

The program is designed to encourage young 4-Hers to begin new projects by eliminating potential cost burdens they may have; as well as encourage new individuals to become active in the White County 4-H program.

4-Hers ages 8-14 are eligible to apply. Applications must be completed by the 4-Her and signed off by a parent/guardian and the 4-H Club Leader. Applications are due March 1, 2021.

Applications are available from 4-H club leaders, the White County Extension office, and the White County Farm Bureau. Applications can also be downloaded at www.whitecfb.com.

Area Hunters Can Earn Certification

Area residents will have an opportunity to learn basic principles of safe hunting at the Illinois Department of Natural Resources hunter safety certification course. Participants must attend <u>all 10</u> <u>hours</u> of instruction and pass the test to receive their certification.

The workshop times are Tuesday, March 2 & Thursday, March 4 from 6-8pm and Saturday, March 6, 9am-3pm at the First Baptist Church in Carmi.

The course is geared toward youth, but older hunters are also encouraged to attend the classes since many states now require out-of-state hunters to show proof of certification. A 1996 Illinois law requires that all hunters born after Jan. 1, 1980 must successfully complete the hunter education course before they can receive their first hunting license. Participants completing the course receive a hunter education certification card which verifies they have passed the course.

The ten-hour course includes instruction in wildlife management, firearms safety, hunter ethics, game identification, first aid, survival techniques and regulations. The lead instructor will be Bobby Lamp.

Pre-registration is not required, but would be helpful. To register, one may call the Extension office at 382-2662 by March 1. Space is limited to 25 participants.


