Clever Cricuts - Beginner Design Space and Maker SPIN Club

Clever Cricuts - Beginner Design Space and Maker SPIN is a new multi-county club opportunity based in Gallatin County.

These introductory levels class will allow youth to design, create & complete projects with Cricut Makers using Design Space. Participants are encouraged to create a free Cricut account and download the free Design Space app on their tablet, iPad or smartphone.

Through the 6 meetings participants will learn how to design using Cricut Design Space and create projects using vinyl and cardstock on materials such as plastic, glass and wood.

Space is limited to the first 4 members ages 8 and up from each county. (Gallatin, Hamilton, Pope-Hardin, Saline & White). While you may get a confirmation email this does not guarantee your spot if the 4 spaces for your county have been filled.

A \$20 materials fee will apply - all materials for projects will be provided. Payment should be paid at the first meeting either via check made out to University of Illinois Extension or cash.

Classes are scheduled to be held in the back meeting room of the Gallatin County Farm Bureau located at 216 S Murphy, Ridgway, IL 62979. Meetings will begin promptly at 6:00 pm and last approximately an hour and a half on the following **Thursdays: Oct. 21, Oct. 28, Nov. 4, Nov. 11, Nov. 18 and Dec. 2.**

When you submit your form you are tentatively confirmed-please wait for a follow up email from Kassy Scates at kscates@illinois.edu. Each registration is time stamped to insure we are able to enroll the first 4 individuals from each of our 5 counties.

If your county already has 4 members enrolled you will waitlisted. If one of the counties does not fill its 4 allotted slots, members from other counties will be notified they are eligible to fill those spaces (this will be decided by viewing the registration time stamp- so the earlier you signed up the better chance you have of having a space).

4-H Pumpkin Contest

4-H in our county is an incredible experience. We need to let the public know that we are here, active, and excited! There's no better way to do this, than to make sure that our activities are front and center in our communities. With this in mind, all White County 4-H members are invited to participate in a Pumpkin Contest this year.

Contest guidelines are as follows:

- Members may only enter one pumpkin.
 (More than one pumpkin may be used to make a display)
- 2. Pumpkins should be 4-H audience appropriate.
- 3. Pumpkins must be decorated and finished at home. Then send a photo of the pumpkin to amccarty@illinois.edu.
- 4. Do NOT put your name on your pumpkin...put your name on a piece of paper and put it under your pumpkin.
- 5. Pumpkins can be painted, decorated, dressed up, or a combination of these. CARVED WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED
- 6. 1st place ribbons will be awarded in each category. Age divisions are: Cloverbuds (Ages 5-7), Juniors (Ages 8-12), and Seniors (Ages 13-18).
- 7. Judging Criteria: originality, ingenious use of pumpkin, quality of work, and quality of work in light of the participant's age.
- 8. Pumpkins MUST be ORIGINAL! Pumpkin must be painted or dressed up by the 4-H members. No pumpkins bought pre-painted or created will be accepted!

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4-H Scarecrow Challenge

It's fall! In our neck of the woods farmers are out harvesting their fields, it's a smidge cooler and campfire season is almost here. Mums and pumpkins are making their appearances in stores - along with SCARECROWS!

Our challenge to you as 4-H members is to make a scarecrow out of things around the house- no buying a pre-made one. NO buying anything! A good old fashioned scarecrow wearing a 4-H clover!

Once you've made one - put it on display, take a picture and send it to your EPC (Amy McCarty) to be shared on social media. Each county will have a favorite scarecrow selected. One scarecrow will be selected as an overall favorite from our Gallatin, Hamilton, Pope-Hardin, Saline and White county unit.

Your scarecrow may be of the seated or hanging variety (you'll need to make some type of frame for it to stand).

Here is a suggested list of body parts and supplies:

Head: a pillowcase, fake pumpkin, piece of burlap or other material. For a round head you'll want some sort of stuffing such as plastic grocery bags, that throw pillow the dog tore up, or even a bouncy ball (unless you decide to try a pumpkin). You may also want to put a hat of some sort on it - up to you!

Upper body: Long sleeved shirt and some type of stuffing (while straw is traditional plastic grocery bags, newspapers and even old pillows work)

Lower body: bib-overalls, pants or a dress.

Arms, legs, hands & feet: there are lots of ways to make a scarecrow. Many that hang on a frame don't have stuffed arms and legs so they flutter. Seated versions tend to have stuffed arms and legs. If you choose to stuff your scarecrow arms and legs grocery bags, newspapers, rolled t-shirts and even old pool noodles can give it shape. Old gloves, corn shucks or drink bottles can work as hands and old socks or an old pair of shoes can be feet.

Hint... wire hangers, bucket, or even flower pots are very useful in making a scarecrow.

These are just some suggestions to help you plan your creation! Remember- the 4-H clover MUST be displayed prominently on the scarecrow.

Feel free to make a traditional version or something a little more modern.

We can't wait to see what you create!

A brief, basic how to video will come later this month.
