The Livingston-McLean-Woodford Livestock Judging Team is kicking off the 2020 livestock judging calendar with meetings/practices at both Pontiac Township High School and Normal West High School the end of January. No experience or background required and open to all 4-H members from 8 to 18 years old! We are proud to have members compete in junior divisions as well as top senior divisions. Livestock judging is the evaluation of live meat animals: beef, swine, sheep, and meat goats. The team had an outstanding 2019 with members competing in several National Contests!! Practices begin in January with us attending approximately 5 contests through March and April, before the State Contest in June. Practices and competitions are open to what works for you and your family, without commitment or expectation to attend them all. If schedules don't free up until later in the season, you are still welcome to join. Our goal is for everyone to learn from each experience, therefore we welcome whatever approach works for you. New Training/Certification Required for Livestock Exhibitors beginning 2019-2020

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the Youth for the Quality Care of Animal certification (YQCA). It will replace former specific trainings: PQA and QAEC. This program is the industry-standard certification.

The training must be completed each year and local Extension offices will offer the training.

Horses, dogs, and cats will still be required to take the Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAEC) training. This training is only required once in the member's career.

Selection is based on the total number of family members with 4-H connections, the total number of years of 4-H involvement, the diversity of experiences and recognitions earned by the 4-H members, and the collective impact that family members have made as advocates of their county and state 4-H programs. Reminder while youth are out there working on 4-H projects: Understanding Copyright and Trademark Laws

When an author, musician, designer, or artist creates something, it is immediately protected by copyright or trademark laws and other people can't use it or create something similar. Original works such as stories, music, pictures, plays, dances, sculpture, movies, and architecture are protected. 4–H members should use caution when working on a speech, display, or exhibit so you don't use something that doesn't belong to you.

4-H members can't draw or copy someone else's design, logo, words, or music without the permission of the original owner. That means, you can't draw a logo (such as Ford or John Deere) and use it on your exhibit. You can't create Mickey Mouse ears on your cake. You can't draw a Disney princess. You can't put SpongeBob image on your natural resource project exhibit board.

Think of it like this. You wouldn't take your neighbor's bike and ride it around to make your life easier without getting permission first. That would be stealing. When you take words, art, graphics, or photographs that aren't yours but use them like they are, that's stealing, too. Copying them from the internet is the same as stealing them unless you are using a site specifically created for free use of images.
