Youth for the Quality Care of Animals is still the required

yearly ethics training for members enrolled in beef, goats, sheep & swine.

Due to Covid restrictions, we are not able to hold in -person trainings. We will reevaluate the situation in the spring to see if we can offer live certifications. The



training is always available online at <u>yqca.org</u>. It is \$12 to take it online and there are Junior (8-11), Intermediate (12-14) & Senior (15-18) levels. To test out of an age division, you must be in the beginning year of the level either 8, 12 or 15.

Quality Assurance and Ethics (QAEC) is required **ONCE** in a 4-H career for members enrolled in dogs, cats, small pets, horses, rabbits and poultry. It is free and can be found at:



Horse Bowl & Hippology

Regional contests will be virtual this year and held on March 13, 2021. **Registration deadline is February 18.**

County staff will register youth via 4-H Online. All required participant information for registration should be sent to the county office by **February 15.**

Horse bowl teams consist of 4 members plus one alternate. Junior division is for 8 -13 year olds as of January 1, 2021. Senior is 14-18 as of January 1, 2021. Entrants must be enrolled in 4-H.

Hippology has three age divisions:

Junior - 8-11 Intermediate - 12-14 Senior 15-18

Online contests will be run through Compass Blackboard and a camera will be required for proctoring.

- *Farrowed on or after February 10, 2021
- *Weighed & Tattooed by April 15, 2021
- *Tattooed within 35 days of birth
- *Must not weigh more than 1 lb/day of age

Wethers & Ewe Lambs:

- *Weighed & Tattooed between March 15 & May 15, 2021
- * Lambed on or after January 1, 2021
- --Contact Jennifer if you wish to tattoo pigs or sheep for the Premiere shows.

Note to ALL State Fair sheep & goat exhibitors:

The nomination process will be the same as last year. You will self-nominate and include a picture of the Scrapie tag in the animal's ear. Forms are available from the Extension office and due May 15, 2021.

4-H Memorial Scholarship

4-H Memorial Scholarship was established by memorial funds from Dylis McCutchan and Daniel McLaughlin and memorials made to honor Dylis and Daniel. Dylis was a leader of Hamlet Handy Helpers for over 40 years. Daniel was a Mercer County 4-H alumni and a long-time member of the Young Riders 4-H club. Both of these individuals knew first-hand the value and impact that 4-H can have. The scholarship funds continue to grow as more people donated in memory of loved ones. As a result, the scholarship committee continues to increase the scholarship payouts and/or scholarships available. The Memorial Scholarship is open to current Mercer County 4-H members graduating from high school or in their final year of 4-H. Patti Jeanne Higgins 4-H Scholarship—This scholarship is for one year, available to high school seniors or persons enrolled in the first year of college, university, technical, or vocational school. Two \$500 scholarships will be awarded each year. Applicant must be a resident of Mercer or Warren County. Applicant must have been actively involved in 4-H for a minimum of three years. Preference will be given to applicants who are or were a member of the Alexis All-Star 4-H Club. Applicant is required to verify acceptance to or present enrollment at a college or university prior to receiving the grant. Applicant shall be required to submit a written application. In addition to eligibility guidelines, the following will be considered in selecting recipients: Academic performance and honors Rank in class ACT score Financial need Character and personality: Consideration shall be given to maturity; industriousness and motivation; intellectual interest; moral character; and demonstrated leadership. Rock Island County Bert Blood Scholarship

The Rock Island County Extension & 4-H Education Foundation and the Rock Island Rotary Club are cosponsoring college/trade school scholarships for Rock Island County 4-H members and recent graduates.

Eligibility: Rock Island County 4-H members who are seniors in high school are eligible to apply for one of three scholarships that will be awarded in the amounts of \$1,500, \$1,250 and \$1,000. Rock Island County 4-H alumni who will be enrolled as sophomores, juniors and seniors in college or trade school in 2021-2022 can apply for two \$500 scholarships. All checks will be made out to the college or trade school to which the winners are enrolled. The awards funded 50/50 by Rotary and the Foundation.

Deadline: Applications and reference forms are due to the Rock Island County Extension office, 321 W 2nd Ave. Milan, IL 61264 by Monday March 15, 2021 (or postmarked by Friday, March 12, 2021.)

The scholarship applications ask about 4-H experience, community service and career plans. The committee is interested to hear about the lessons and impact that being a part of 4-H has made on the applicant's life and future goals. There is also a 4-H reference form that goes with the application and that should be completed by two references (ie: 4-H leader, Extension/4-H staff, coach, teacher, clergy, boss or other mentor/supervisor).

Announcements: The top high school finalists will be asked to prepare a 3-minute presentation about their project to the Rock Island Rotary Club members via ZOOM on Tuesday, April 13, 2021 at their noon meeting. The winners will then learn about which scholarship amount they will receive - first, second or third.
