Beef: Refer to Project and Activity Book for Breeds

Registered calf under 6 months
Registered 6 month – 12 month heifer
Registered 12 month – 18 month heifer
Registered 18 month and up cow

Crossbred calf under 6 months
Crossbred calf 6 month – 12 months heifer
Crossbred calf 12 month – 18 months heifer
Crossbred calf 18 month and up cow

Market Class – Any animal showing as a breeding animal is not eligible for market class. Entry limited to two animals.

Sheep: Refer to Project and Activity Book for Breeds

Registered:

- Ram Lamb under 1 year
- Ewe (1 year and under 2)

- Ewe (over 2)

Non – Registered:

- Ram Lamb under 1 year
- Ewe (1 year and under 2)
- Ewe Lamb
- Ewe (over 2)

Market Class: Wether Lamb born after Jan. 1 of current year, limited to two animals. Entry not eligible to be shown in breeding classes. No ewes allowed.

Swine:

All Purebred:

- Purebred Barrow Heavyweight (Not shown in Market class)
- Purebred Barrow Lightweight (Not shown in Market class)
- Purebred Gilt (born after Jan. 1 of current year)
- Purebred Gilt (born after Feb. 1 of current year)

Crossbred breeding Gilt shown by weight (Limited to 2 entries no matter what weight)

Market Class – Limited to 2 entries no matter what weight.

Poultry:

Each class limited to 2 entries

White Egg Layers

- One Rooster – hatched before January 1
- One Hen – hatched before January 1
- One Cockerel – hatched January 1 or after
- One Pullet – hatched January 1 or after

Colored Egg Layers

- One Rooster- hatched before January 1
- One Hen – hatched before January 1
- One Cockerel – hatched January 1 or after
- One Pullet – hatched January 1 or after

Fancy Breeds – Bantams, Polish and Feather-Footed

- One Rooster – hatched before January 1
- One Hen – hatched before January 1
- One Cockerel – hatched January 1 or after
- One Pullet – hatched January 1 or after

Game Birds – Quail, Pheasants, Chuckars, Pigeons and Doves

Market Classes (any type of fowl under 1 year of age)

- Fryer (4 lb. and under)

Limit 2 entries per class

- Senior Buck (6 month and up)
- Senior Doe (6 month and up)
- Junior Buck (under 6 month)
- Junior Doe (under 6 month)

Market Animal Classes (6 month and under)

- Fryer (5.5 lbs. and under)
- Roaster (5.6 lbs. and over)

Horse:

- Halter Class – All classes and ages combined
- Showmanship – All classes and ages combined
- Horsemanship – All classes and ages combined

Dog:

Dog Care – judged on heel, sit, stay and health

Beginner Novice I Class (50401)

(For inexperienced handlers and inexperienced dogs)

1. Heel on Leash (forward, halt, right turn, left turn, about turn, slow, normal and fast). The last order signifies that the handler and dog must break pace. These orders will be given by utilizing posted signs Maximum points 40

- 2. Sit for Exam (on leash) Maximum points 40
- 3. Recall (off leash front/no finish) Maximum points 40
- Qualifying score needed for state advancement100**

Beginner Novice II Class (50402)

(For experienced handlers and inexperienced dogs, or experienced dogs and inexperienced handlers.)

- 1. Heel on Leash (forward, halt, right turn, left turn, about turn, slow, normal and fast). The last order signifies that the handler and dog must break pace. These orders will be given by utilizing posted signs Maximum points 40
- 2. Sit for Exam (on leash) Maximum points 40
- 3. Recall (off leash front/no finish) Maximum points 40
- Qualifying score needed for state advancement.....100**

Preferred Novice Class (50403)

- 1. Figure 8 (on leash) and Heel on Leash Maximum points 40
- 2. Stand for Examination (off leash) Maximum points 30
- 3. Recall (off leash with finish) Maximum points 30
- 4. Down, Stay-Get Your Leash (off leash) Maximum points 30
- Qualifying score needed for state advancement.....110**

Novice Class (50404)

- 1. Figure 8 (on leash) Heal Free (off leash) Maximum points 40
- 2. Stand for Examination (off leash) Maximum points 30
- 3. Recall (off leash with finish)..... Maximum points 30
- 4. Down Stay get your leash (off leash) Maximum points 30
- Qualifying score needed for state advancement.....110**

Graduate Novice Class (50405)

- 1. Heel Free and Figure 8 (off leash) Maximum points 40
- 2. Drop on Recall Maximum points 40
- 3. Dumbbell Recall Maximum points 30
- 4. Sit, Stay-Get your leash..... Maximum points 30
- Qualifying score needed for state advancement.....115**
