Explore the nation's capital

For over 50 years, thousands of 4-H members have traveled to Washington, DC to participate in Citizenship Washington Focus, a life-changing week that empowers 4-H'ers to take their leadership skills to the next level for themselves and their communities. The trip is July 4 – 11, 2020. You must be at least 14 by May 1, 2020. During the week, you will explore the federal legislative process through workshops and hands-on sessions, tour historical sights and museums, give your voice on issues, visit federal legislative offices, and meet teens from other states. The 2020 cost is estimated to be \$1,305, with financial assistance being provided from the Illinois 4-H Foundation. Registration dead-line is Friday, January 3, 2020. Create a winning video

The World of 7 Billion video contest challenges you to think critically about some of the planets most pressing issues and to come up with solutions. Share what you've learned in a 60-second video. The contest is currently open for the 2019-2020 school year! The contest is open to all middle and high school students worldwide, and the deadline for submissions is February 27, 2020. Up to \$1,000 in cash prizes will be awarded to 80 student winners.

Understanding copyright and trademark laws

When an author, musician, designer, or artist creates something, it is immediately protected by copyright or trademark laws and other people can't use it or create something similar. Original works such as stories, music, pictures, plays, dances, sculpture, movies, and architecture are protected. 4-H members should use caution when working on a speech, display, or exhibit so you don't use something that doesn't belong to you.

4-H members can't draw or copy someone else's design, logo, words, or music without the permission of the original owner. That means, you can't draw a logo (such as Ford or John Deere) and use it on your exhibit. You can't create Mickey Mouse ears on your cake. You can't draw a Disney princess. You can't put SpongeBob image on your natural resource project exhibit board.

Think of it like this. You wouldn't take your neighbor's bike and ride it around to make your life easier without getting permission first. That would be stealing. When you take words, art, graphics, or photographs that aren't yours but use them like they are, that's stealing, too. Copying them from the internet is the same as stealing them unless you are using a site specifically created for free use of images.

Annual re-enrollment of 4-H members was due on December 1, if they want to be eligible to exhibit 4-H projects at the 2020 Wabash County Fair.

New members must be enrolled by March 1 in order to be eligible to exhibit at the fair.

The deadline to add projects to any member's enrollment, if they want to exhibit that project at the fair, is also March 1.

New members should contact the Extension office for instructions to complete the online enrollment in the 4HOnline system.

The following should be noted when going through the online process:

- When you are in the section where you select projects, don't forget to select project manuals from the drop-down box, if you need them. When selecting project manuals, a price will be displayed next to the title. Just disregard this price. You will not actually be charged for the manuals.
- When you get to the fee payment part, <u>DO NOT</u> pay with a credit card. Make sure the option to pay with a check is selected. You will then not actually send in a check, because the fee will be covered again this year. If you pay with a credit card, you will not be refunded.

Club Meeting Reminders/Updates:

- All clubs are required to have at least six meetings during the course of the 4-H year. These should take place before July 1 of the 4-H year, so that there is enough time before the fair to verify meeting attendance requirements for 4-H members to be eligible to exhibit at the fair.
- In order to be eligible to exhibit at the fair, 4-H members must have attended at least 2/3 of the meetings that their club held.
 - * Members may make up <u>2</u> missed meetings by attending workshops, other county 4-H events, meetings of another club, or (if of high school or college freshman age) at Federation meeting.
 - College freshman aged 4-H'ers who are living in Wabash County must adhere to the same meeting attendance requirements as above. Those living away at a college/university must attend one meeting of the club or other county 4-H event and write a typed 2 page report explaining the impact 4-H has had on her or his life, which will be turned in to the Extension office.

FARM CREDIT ILLINOIS SCHOLARSHIPS

High school seniors planning careers in agriculture may apply for a \$2,000 scholarship. Farm Credit Illinois will provide 30 scholarships to youth who live or farm in one of the 60 counties in their service area. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)

Beginning this year, all 4-H'ers planning to exhibit animals of the following species at the fair are required to complete the YQCA certification annually:

- Beef Cattle
- Dairy Cattle
- Goats (both meat and dairy)
- Sheep
- Swine

There will be two options to complete it: a live classroom style training and online. The live classroom training will cost \$3.00 per person, with the online option costing \$12.00 per person.

More information on this, including the dates of the classroom options, will be forthcoming as the local Extension office receives more information.
