You see them at state 4-H events in their bright green shirts. Now YOU can become an Illinois State 4-H Youth Leadership Team member.

Eligibility: Age 16 to 19 by September 1, 2019.

Length of service: Two years, so new Team members selected this summer will serve from

September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2021.

Apply online: go.illinois.edu/4HYLT. Look for the application at the bottom of the page under "Resources."

Deadline: June 7 (for interviews during Illini Summer Academies); July 19 (for interviews during State Fair).

The State Youth Leadership Team plans the state Jr. Leadership Conference, plans and teaches the Speaking for Illinois 4-H program, and assists for many other statewide events. Team members may serve on statewide planning committees and advisory groups, including the Illinois 4-H Foundation Board of Directors, Illinois Farm Bureau Youth Education Committee, Illini Summer Academies planning committee, and Teen Leadership Conference planning committee. Members also have the first opportunity to attend National 4-H Conference in Washington, D.C. each spring.

Your video should be no longer than 90 seconds.

Every video should end with "Because of 4-H, I Thanks for helping me grow!"

There are divisions for 4-H Members, 4-H Volunteers, and 4-H Alumni!!!!!!

Send the video file to us at <u>illinois4H@illinois.edu</u> or post it to YouTube and share the link in an email to us. Be sure to save the original file in case we need it later.

Include your first name, your county, and your 4-H club name.

A parent or friend can record you—you're not being evaluated on the video but on your 4-H story. Of course, the more creative the video content, the better your chance of winning.

It's okay to tell your story over time. For example, you may want to be show a lamb when it's born, as you work on it, then in the show ring and put all those clips together into your entry.

Videos will be accepted from May 1 to August 1. Winners will be announced and shown at the Illinois State Fair.

Finalists may be asked to improve or edit their video to comply with Extension 4-H guidelines before their prize is awarded.

Quality Assurance and Ethics Certification (QAEC)

All 4-H members who are planning to exhibit beef, dairy, goat, horse, poultry, swine, sheep, rabbit, dog, and cat projects for the first time MUST complete online QAEC to show at Fair. This rule applies to 4-H Members who exhibit live animals AND poster exhibits. This is a one time certification and is valid your entire 4-H career. You only need to take QAEC in one livestock area regard-less of the number of livestock projects you are enrolled in. All members needing to take QAEC have been sent a notice in the mail.

The deadline to complete QAEC is JUNE 1.

The table below provides the dates by which animals to be exhibited at the fair must be owned and cared for by the exhibitors, along with the dates by which the animals must have been born.

Note that this online process is only for your 4-H projects and has nothing to do with the Junior Fair project entry process.

Volunteers Wanted!

Poultry Exhibitors:

Due to a shortage of antigen, the Pullorum-Typhoid testing of birds for exhibition is being <u>waived</u> for the 2019 show season. The following is a statement from the Illinois Department of Agriculture:

"Due to the shortage of antigen necessary to conduct Pullorum-Typhoid testing, the State of Illinois is waiving the pullorum requirements for birds or hatching eggs sold within or imported into the State as well as the testing requirements for exhibition. Once antigen becomes available, this waiver will be rescinded and all flocks participating in the National Poultry Improvement Plan will be required to conduct their annual test. Reciprocity with other states is not guaranteed and producers / exhibitors are responsible for contacting those state officials regarding compliance with entry requirements."

Club Meeting Reminders:

- All clubs are required to have at least six meetings during the course of the 4-H year.
 These should take place before July 1 of the 4-H year, so that there is enough time before the fair to verify meeting attendance requirements for 4-H members to be eligible to exhibit at the fair.
- In order to be eligible to exhibit at the fair, 4-H members must have attended at least 2/3 of the meetings that their club held.
