Wax Amaryllis Bulb





STEP 1: GATHER MATERIALS:

- AMARYLLIS BULB
- SHARP KNIFE
- BOWL OF WATER AND TOWEL
- WAX
- SAUCEPAN OR HOTPLATE
- CLEANED OUT TIN CONTAINER
- SMALL PAINTBRUSH

STEP 2:

- SOAK BULB UNTIL FULLY HYDRATED



STEP 3:

- CUT OFF BASAL PLATE



STEP 4:

- PEAL OUTER BULB LAYER
- DRY BULB WITH TOWEL





STEP 5:

- MELT WAX IN CAN, NOT TOO HOT
- APPLY WAX TO BULB, DIP INTO WAX OR PAINT WITH BRUSH

STEP 6:

- APPLY ADDITIONAL DECOR AS DESIRED





- KEEP IN A WARM LOCATION AWAY FROM DIRECT SUNLIGHT

Amaryllis are tender bulbs native to tropical areas and do not require a cold period. Amaryllis are capable of water forcing which makes them good candidates for waxing. Bulb nutrient reserves are used to support plant growth and flowering.
