4-H Holiday Tree Contest

4-H in Wayne County is an incredible experience. We need to let the public know that we are here, active and excited. There's no better way to do this, than to make sure our activities are front and center of our communities. With this in mind, all Wayne County 4-H members are invited to participate in a Holiday Tree Contest this year. Contest guidelines are as follows:



- 1. Members may participate as individuals, or as a group (2 or more).
- 2. Prize money will be awarded for the top individual, and the top group displays. The individual and group prize of \$50 will be presented to your 4-H club in time for your February meeting. Winners will be announced after judging!
- 3. Each tree must have a 4-H theme.
- 4. Name of Individual, or group Making Tree Display should be visible.
- 5. Trees should be placed in a public location where it is visible to the general community as a promotion of the 4-H program for at least one week during the month of December. The longer it's on display, the better! (must be removed by Jan. 1st)
- 6. Trees must be decorated and in place by Saturday, December 7, 2019.
- 7. You must contact the Wayne County Extension office (618-842-3702) to register your tree and with information regarding the location of your tree and who is involved (individuals or group) by Friday, November 29. We will need to know the exact date of when your tree will be in place.
- 8. Trees can be for promotion, community service, or any other creative idea you may have. Example: Promotion –4-H ornaments, club information, just for beauty.
- 9. Trees will be judged on creativity, theme & purpose.

YOUTH THE QUALITY CARE THAN IMALS

New certification required for Youth exhibiting livestock

4-H members exhibiting animals entering the food production system will be required to complete the **Youth for the Quality Care of Animal** certification (YQCA). It will replace former trainings: PQA and QAEC. This program is the industry-standard certification. Check with local offices about completing the training. **The training must be completed each year**.

Horses, dogs, and cats will still be required to take the **Quality Assurance and Ethics** (QAEC) training. This training is only required once in the member's career.

GET CASH TO HELP IMPROVE YOUR COMMUNITY



Looking for funding support to conduct community service outreach in your community? Farm Credit Illinois is ready to help Illinois 4-H clubs and FFA chapters bring positive and visible change to Illinois communities! Fifty \$500 Community Improvement Grants are available. Clubs must be located in one of the 60 central and southern Illinois counties served by Farm Credit Illinois. Check if your club is eligible and apply after November 1 at farm-creditll.com. Be sure to contact your LOCAL EXTENSION OFFICE BEFORE applying for this grant to ensure you follow all fiscal requirements!

Understanding copyright and trademark laws

When an author, musician, designer, or artist creates something, it is immediately protected by copyright or trademark laws and other people can't use it or create something similar. Original works such as stories, music, pictures, plays, dances, sculpture, movies, and architecture are protected. 4-H members should use caution when working on a speech, display, or exhibit so you don't use something that doesn't belong to you.

4-H members can't draw or copy someone else's design, logo, words, or music without the permission of the original owner. That means, you can't draw a logo (such as Ford or John Deere) and use it on your exhibit. You can't create Mickey Mouse ears on your cake. You can't draw a Disney princess. You can't put SpongeBob image on your natural resource project exhibit board.

Think of it like this. You wouldn't take your neighbor's bike and ride it around to make your life easier without getting permission first. That would be stealing. When you take words, art, graphics, or photographs that aren't yours but use them like they are, that's stealing, too. Copying them from the internet is the same as stealing them unless you are using a site specifically created for free use of images.
