

Are your meeting minutes up-to-date, and have they been signed/approved by the club president (or whoever your club decided?) Your minutes are the official record of your clubs financial decisions-documentation of approval of spending money is required to back up your clubs account activities. Also, a win win when you hand them into the office you are entered to potentially win Top Secretary Award for 2019! **Due Sept. 27** 

#### Treasurer Book / Annual Financial statement Due

Is your clubs Treasurers book up-to-date? All clubs with a checking or savings account must complete both pages of the 4-H club Annual Financial Statement for at the end of each 4-H year (Sept. 1—Aug. 31) The Club treasurer and club leader must sign on page 2 of this form to verify. Also, on page 2, a group of (2 or 3 youth and adults who do not have signatory rights on the club's bank account must review the financial records for the past year and sign. **Due Sept. 27**

### **BECOME A CERTIFIED 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS INSTRUCTOR**

### One day is all you need. . .

Help ensure young people are exposed to everything the outdoors and shooting sports has to offer by becoming a certified 4-H shooting sports volunteer.

- ⇒ Your first stop is the local Extension office where staff will discuss the current program in our county.
- ⇒ Complete the required application and background checks. Volunteers must be at least 21 years of age.
- ⇒ Pay the \$60 registration cost that covers three meals, snacks, instructor curriculum, hat, and all necessary equipment and materials for the training.
- ⇒ Staff will complete your registration. Registration is due October 9.
- ⇒ Attend certification training from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturday, October 19 at 4-H Memorial Camp near Monticello. Do not bring firearms or bows. Do bring eye and ear protection.
- ⇒ Complete additional online training.
- ⇒ Check back in with the county Extension staff to begin volunteering.

There are six concentrations of study, and volunteers must choose only one discipline: archery, rifle, shotgun, pistol, and hunting and outdoor skills, as well as the overall county coordinator training. Remember, volunteers will work with their local Extension 4-H staff to establish or add to an existing shooting sports program in the county.
