Qualifications: Enrollment in the Public Presentations project is required to participate in this section. No live animals are allowed in speeches. Youth must be selected in a local county 4-H contest to advance to the state contest. Each county is allowed three entries in the state contest. The entries may come from any of the four divisions. Each youth may only compete in up to one individual division and one group division in the state contest.

Participating Youth must be 8 years of age on or before September 1, 2021.

Participating youth turning 14 years of age on or before **April 30, 2022 must** enroll as advanced.

Youth may submit their favorite photo (with no or minimal editing) with up to three sentences of why it's special to them. Deadline to submit an image is 11:59 p.m. on March 31, 2022. Volunteer 4-H photography judges will review all submissions, provide feedback and select the top images for special awards. All submissions will be entered into a prize drawing. Submitted images will be featured in a digital slideshow shared with participants and posted on Minnesota 4-H's Facebook and YouTube channels.

Judging will be based on conservation message (50%) visual effectiveness (30%) originality (10%) universal appeal (10%).
