Making the best in each of us better Mastery: Engagement in Learning

Mastery is defined as gaining knowledge and developing skills and attitudes AND the ability to accurately use the knowledge, skills and attitudes in your everyday life.

To achieve mastery, you need to be engaged and interested. Simply having a learning experience is not enough. Youth need to be involved in the learning process and given opportunities to successfully meet challenges and solve problems. Engaged youth are curious and focused on learning. They develop relationships and connections that enhance learning. Youth who are actively engaged in learning have a higher degree of self-motivation and creativity, set goals and work towards reaching those goals, and are more likely to develop selfconfidence and feel they are capable of succeeding.

4-H clubs are a perfect place for youth at develop these positive life skills, but only if clubs are actively doing things to promote this learning. Simply having a club meeting isn't enough. To foster engagement consider:

Are club activities based on a hands on, learn by doing approach to learning?

curiosity, questioning and exploration?

Do club activities provide experiences that make a difference to others or relate to real life situations?

Consider these tips:

Involve members in planning and organizing club activities. Club officers should take the lead in organizing activities by using committees to plan events and activities so more members are involved in the decision process. Adult volunteers should serve as facilitators, supporting the youth, not leading the process.

Encourage members to take on leadership roles within the club. Allow all members, regardless of age, to have a voice in program/activity planning.

Allow time for youth to reflect on their success and failures. Things do not always work out as planned. It is important to discuss the situation, what worked, and what didn't. The best learning experiences are not always the most perfect.

Engagement is the spark that can create excitement that leads to learning ... and that leads to self -confident, capable adults.
