## **NEW for 2020 County Fairs in Unit 21**

With the 2020 4-H Fair season quickly approaching there will be a few policy and procedures put into effect for our exhibitors this show year. First, as a reminder the only two species that are allowed to be leased are horses and canine. All other livestock are exempt from the lease provision.

Second, exhibitors wishing to show beef, goats, and sheep will be required to submit photos of their project. Required photos will include full view of left side, full view of right side and any and all other identifiable distinguishing marks or scars.

**PHOTOS OF MARKET LIVESTOCK** – Species that are required to submit photos of their animals are: beef, sheep, swine, and goat.


- a. Beef will receive tattoos in each ear. All beef steers are required to come to weigh in. Beef weigh in is February 1, 2020 from 9-11 a.m. (Baby Beef is not required to weigh in)
- b. Swine exhibitors will need to produce ear notches and tag numbers by July 1.
- c. Sheep & Goats take a picture of scrapie tags. All photos must be turned into the Effingham Extension office by June 1.
  - ♦ Sheep will weigh-in on Saturday, May 2, 2020 from 9-10 a.m.
  - ♦ Boer/Dairy Goats June 6 from 9 to 10 a.m., ALL wethers must be weighed in at Effingham County Fairgrounds.

#### 4-H ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

Reminder for ALL 4-H families, superintendents, or volunteers that you will need to go to the 4-H Online website to register your children for the current 4-H year. If you don't remember your password, select "I Forgot My Password", use the email address that you gave last year and it will prompt you to create a new password. Follow the step- by- step enrollment process and submit enrollment at the end. If you have more than one child you will have to do one for each of them. ## YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)

The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. It also replaces the Quality Assurance & Ethics (QAEC) program for youth in the following species; dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program yearly starting for the 2020 show season. Youth must either attend a face to face class or certify on-line via the website <a href="http://yqca.org">http://yqca.org</a> The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is annual with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The estimated cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.



# QUALITY ASSURANCE & ETHICS (QA&E):

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for all youth that enroll in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats. Members must take the training whether they own a live animal or not. It is advised that they complete this one time as soon as they are enrolled in the project area. Counties will monitor completion of this. Failure to complete QA&E will result in the member's animal science project enrollment being cancelled and they will be ineligible to exhibit at county fairs. The website is open year round @ http://web.extension.illinois.edu/qaec/

NOTE: Youth must be logged on to a computer for this program, either a desktop or laptop; not an iPad or iPhone. The program cannot capture the information for county staff to see when it is completed using iPads or iPhones.

## **Livestock Tagging Information**

Jasper County 4-H members exhibiting beef, dairy, swine, sheep and goats are required to have your market animals and crossbred animals tagged to show at the upcoming Jasper County shows. Tags can be picked up at the Jasper County office during office hours.

Market Steer wishing to exhibit at the Illinois State Fair, OR animals wishing to participate in the beef rate of gain competition must bring their animals to the beef tagging on February 8 from **9 AM to 10 AM** at the Kendall Tarr Farm.



Crossbred beef animals exhibiting at the Jasper County Fair also need to be tagged to exhibit. If you have an older animal with tags from a previous year, record those numbers on the tagging form.

#### **NEW THIS YEAR!**

- 1. Every club member needs to attend at least 2 club meetings and 1 club or county event during the 4-H year in order to be eligible for advancement to the Illinois State Fair general projects showing and in order to sell an animal in the Jasper Co. 4-H Auction. We realize it is hard to make it to all events, but we believe 2 meetings plus 1 event per year is an attainable goal. If a family is having trouble making it to a club meeting due to the day and/or time they meet each month, please contact the Extension office for a list of other club meeting dates and times. We strongly feel that for our youth to receive the full experience of the 4-H program in Jasper County, that involvement outside of the 4-H shows during fair-time is necessary.

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

YQCA includes information for youth showing the following food animals:

**Beef Cattle** 

**Dairy Cattle** 

Sheep

Goats

The YQCA training can be done either online or in person. To take the training online, go to yqca.org. Click on Sign In/Register at the top of the page, then use your 4-H Online account information to access different trainings. Before the trainings screen appears, you will fill out some basic registration information. Once the training screen comes up, you will be able to choose your age level. After choosing the age level, the next screen will give you two options for trainings. For the online training, proceed with that option.

The estimated cost for the face to face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

#### For members enrolled in dairy cattle, beef cattle, swine, sheep, and goats:

The YQCA is a new livestock quality assurance program that is replacing PQA which no longer exists. All 4-H exhibitors of these animals will be required to certify in the YQCA program each year starting for the 2020 show season. Attend either a face to face class or certify on-line via the website <a href="http://yqca.org">http://yqca.org</a> The YQCA program is for youth ages 8-21. The online version is broken into age divisions as follows: juniors 8-11, intermediate 12-14, senior 15-18, and young adults 19-21. This certification is needed each year with test out options of 1-3 years. Youth exhibiting swine at the Illinois State Fair and 4-H fairs are no longer required to be PQA plus certified. The estimated cost for the face-to-face training will be \$3 and \$12 for the online version.

#### For members enrolled in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs, and cats:

The Quality Assurance and Ethics training is required for youth in horses, rabbits, poultry, dogs and cats. You only need to take it once in your lifetime. Those who don't complete the training will be removed from the animal science project and will not be eligible to exhibit at county fairs.
